INFORMATION AND RULES FOR ADMISSION TO FIRST YEAR M.B.B.S. COURSE 2016-17

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IMPORTANT

- 1. We do not have management quota seats at MGIMS, Sevagram
- 2. We have not authorized any person or institute on behalf of Kasturba Health Society and Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram to speak about admission in the institution.
- 3. All the candidates will be selected through NEET 2016 merit only.

I. COURSE INFORMATION

The duration of study for the M.B.B.S. Degree extends over a total period of $4\frac{1}{2}$ years with four university examinations. The institute is affiliated to Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Nashik (MUHS) for undergraduate and Postgraduate courses. The medium of instruction and examination is English.

After completing the MBBS Course the students are required to undergo one year internship training programme. Before the internship training, it is obligatory for them to apply for provisional registration of the Maharashtra Medical Council. The internship training period is organized for 1 year as per the norms of Medical Council of India and MUHS.

II. ADMISSION TO M.B.B.S. COURSE

Admission to the M.B.B.S. course of Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences is made according to the rules & regulations of the Kasturba Health Society (the parent body) and the institute (MGIMS). These are subject to alterations, amendments and modifications as may be considered necessary from time to time as per directions from supreme court, MCI, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik and the competent authorities of KHS/MGIMS. Any issue not dealt in this prospectus will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the competent authorities of KHS/MGIMS.

1. ELIGIBILITY FOR APPLICATION

A candidate will be eligible for admission to First year M.B.B.S. course of MGIMS on fulfillment of following conditions:

1.1. The candidate must have qualified in the NEET 2016

1.2. The candidate must be an **Indian National**

The candidate is required to produce proof in support of his/her nationality from competent authority e.g. District Magistrate or Metropolitan Magistrate (format of Nationality certificate: Annexure 1/2a/2b) or a valid passport. The original receipt of the application for preparation of passport will also be considered provisionally at the time of admission, however at a later date the candidate has to submit a photocopy of valid passport for enrollment in MUHS, Nashik.

1.3. A candidate must attain 17 years of age on or before 31st December, 2016. The S.S.C. or equivalent examination certificate clearly endorsing the date of birth will only constitute valid proof of the date of birth of the candidate.

- 1.4. The candidate should be medically fit to undergo the professional course. He/She will have to undergo a medical examination at Kasturba Hospital of MGIMS during the time of admission.
- 1.5. The candidate must have passed 12th standard examination under 10+2 system of Maharashtra State Higher Secondary Education Board or an equivalent examination of any recognized Indian Board/University with Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English in first attempt.
 - 1.5.1. **General category candidates** (All those not mentioned in 1.5.2) must secure a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology and he/she should have passed Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English in **first attempt** (format of attempt certificate: **Annexure 3**).
 - 1.5.2. **Constitutional reservation:** Candidates belonging to Scheduled castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), Vimukta Jati (V.J.), Nomadic Tribe (N.T.) and Other Backward Class (O.B.C) including Special Backward Class (SBC) should have obtained not less than 40% of total aggregate marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together in the qualifying Examination. He/she must have passed Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English **in first attempt** (format of attempt certificate: **Annexure 3**).
 - 1.5.3. **Physically Handicapped candidates:** must secure a minimum of 45% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology and he/she should have passed Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English **in first attempt** (format of attempt certificate: **Annexure 3**).
- 1.6. It is the candidate's responsibility to see that he/she possesses the required qualification for admission to M.B.B.S. course. In case any lacuna is found after admission and enrolment is denied by the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik, to which the Institute is affiliated, the Institute shall not be responsible for any loss, direct or indirect to the student on this account.

2. DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS

2.1. Maharashtra/ Non Maharashtra

2.1.1. Those candidates who have passed the S.S.C. (or equivalent) and 12th Standard (or equivalent) examination both from the Schools/Colleges situated in Maharashtra only, shall be treated as Maharashtra candidates.

- 2.1.2. All other eligible candidates, who have passed their S.S.C. (or equivalent) and/or 12th Standard or it's equivalent examination from out side Maharashtra will be treated as Non- Maharashtra candidates.
- 2.2. The permission for admitting 100 students has been given by Government of India vide their letter no MCI-U12012/670/2015-M.E. dated 30th May, 2016 for academic year 2016-17. Distribution of seats available for various cetegories are as shown in the table below

- 2.2.1. Selection for I, II and V (2.2) shall be made on the basis of NEET 2016 merit under the respective category.
- 2.2.2. If a candidate called for counseling does not report by 5.00 P.M. on the date given, the seat will be offered to the next candidate on the waiting list.
- 2.2.3. The seats remaining vacant by 4.00 P.M. on 30th September of the year of admission shall be filled by the management of MGIMS / KHS at it's own discretion.
- 2.2.4. 30% seats are reserved for girl candidates, each in Open, (including Rural & Physically Handicapped) S.C., S.T., V.J., N.T. and OBC categories as per Govt. Resolution. If there is no eligible woman candidate available in any category then the seat will be filled by the eligible male candidate of the same category in the same session. There will be no carrying over of the seats to the next session.

3. CATEGORIES

- 3.1. GENERAL: Those candidates who do not claim to be considered under any reservation in their application form, shall be considered under general category. Those candidates, who claim under any reserve category but their claim is rejected, will also be considered under general category.
- 3.2. RURAL: Rural claim will not be considered unless all original rural certificates (Annexure 4-7) duly signed are produced at the time of verification of certificates for admission. Otherwise candidates will be transferred to general category. Please note that those applying under rural category cannot apply under any other reservation. For deciding the eligibility of a candidate for consideration under rural category, all of the following criteria must be fulfilled at the time of admission
 - 3.2.1. The parents of the candidate must be bonafide residents of a village which does not come under Municipality or Notified area or Town Area Committee. (Annexure 4)
 - 3.2.2. Names of both the parents of the candidate **must** be in the latest voters list of the **village of residence**. (Annexure 4)
 - 3.2.3. **All means** of earning of both the parents must be either from the village of residence or from a village situated in the same district, to which the village of their residence belongs. **(Annexure 5).**
 - 3.2.4. Candidate must have done Pre-High school (first to 8th standard) education for at least 4 continuous years from a school located either in the village of residence or in a village situated in the same district, to which the village of the residence belongs. (Annexure 6).
 - 3.2.5. Candidate must have passed 10th std. examination from a **High school** located either in the village of residence or in a village situated in the same district, to which the village of the residence belongs. (**Annexure 7**)

3.3. CONSTITUTIONAL RESERVATION

3.3.1. 50% seats are reserved for the candidates belonging to SC / ST / VJ / NT/ OBC (including SBC) categories. The candidate claiming the reservation under any of these categories shall produce at the time of verification: **original caste certificate**, **caste validity certificate** and a non-creamy layer certificate (where applicable). For details of

the certificates, please refer to clause 8 under heading 'Verification of Certificates and Admission' and also Annexure 8 to 12

- 3.3.2. Candidates producing Caste validity certificate for constitutional reservation from appropriate authority of Maharashtra state only, are eligible to apply under Maharashtra constitutional reservation seats provided they also fulfill condition as specified under 2.1.1 above (Annexure 11a)
- 3.3.3. Candidates producing Caste validity certificate for constitutional reservation from appropriate authority of respective state only, are eligible to apply under constitutional reservation seats provided they also fulfill condition as specified under 2.1.1 above (Annexure 11b)
- 3.3.4. Constitutional reservation will not be considered unless duly signed and prepared caste certificate, caste validity certificate and a non-creamy layer certificate (where applicable, issued on or after 1st April 2016 and valid up to 31st March 2017) are produced at the time of admission/verification. Such candidates will then be considered under General category as per their merit and no additional time will be given for preparation / production of these certificates.

3.4. PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED (PH)

- 3.4.1. As per G.R. No. SRV-1997/P.K.12/97/16-A dated 2.5.1998

 Three percent (3%) seats are reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates.
- 3.4.2. As per MCI guidelines letter no. MCI-34(1)/2003-Med/11773, dated 14/7/2003 persons having 'locomotary disability of lower limbs' ranging between 50-70% are only eligible to take admission to Health Science Courses. The candidate with disability of lower limbs more than 70% will not be eligible for admission in any category. Persons who are visually handicapped, hearing disabled and locomotary disabled involving upper limb are also not eligible to apply for M.B.B.S. Course in any category.

In case any seat in this 3% quota remains unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% then any such unfilled seat in this 3% quota shall be filled up by persons with locomotory disability of lower limbs

between 40% to 50% - before they are included in the annual sanctioned seats for General Category candidates.

- For seeking the benefit of reservation under PH, the 3.4.3. candidate must bring along proof of his/her disability in original to the MGIMS scrutiny committee at the time of verification of certificates/counselling. The candidate should present himself /herself before a Medical Board comprising of at least one Expert/Specialist from the specialty of Orthopaedics of a Central Government Hospital/ Medical Institution in Delhi & Union Territories or from State Medical Boards in the States and obtain a valid disability certificate (Annexure 13) from the Medical Board. The certificate should have been issued within three months prior to presenting his application for seeking admission in the medical course. In other words, the last valid disability certificate of the candidate from a Medical Board should not be more than three months old from the date of submitting his or her application for seeking admission in the reserved category for physically handicapped **candidates.** (e.g. If the date of submission of application is 1st March 2016 then this certificate should have been issued on or later than 1st Dec 2015).
- 3.4.4. Verification of certificate will be carried out by Medical Board of the Institute at the time of admission at MGIMS. The Medical Board after ascertaining his/her disability will also certify that the candidate is physically fit to undergo the course, despite his/her disability.

NOTE

- If original caste, cast validity, non creamy layer, rural claim, physically handicapped certificates from duly mentioned authorities with proper seal/s and dispatch number are not submitted / produced by the candidates claiming admission under reserved category at the time of verification, admission, the candidates opting for reservation categories shall be considered as general category candidates.
- No additional time will be given for preparing or production of any certificate / document, once called for verification / counselling.

3.5. MAHARASHTRA GOVERNMENT SEATS

Two seats are reserved for nominees of Govt. of Maharashtra and these will be filled as per directions given by the Maharashtra Government.

3.6. SEATS EARMARKED FOR THE "CENTRAL POOL SCHEME" FOR GOVERNMENT OF INDIA

- 3.6.1. Four Seats are earmarked for the "Central Pool Scheme" for Government of India.
- 3.6.2. The selection of candidates is made by the Government of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Directorate General of Health Service (Medical Education Cell), Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi.

Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram shall not accept any application or entertain any enquiry for seats earmarked for the "Central Pool Scheme" for Government of India.

3.7. **KASTURBA HEALTH SOCIETY**: The seats are reserved for the children of Society's confirmed employees and the members of Kasturba Health Society.

4. INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING THE APPLICATION FORM

- 4.1. Candidates seeking admission to M.B.B.S. course of MGIMS should fill the application form online.
- 4.2. It will be the responsibility of parents/guardian to certify that the information provided by the candidate is correct. Filling up of application form by the candidate should be done under the active guidance of parents / guardian.

5. DETERMINATION OF MERIT

- 5.1. Merit shall be determined on the basis of NEET eligibility score of the year of admission
- 5.2. In order to be eligible for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses for a particular academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test to MBBS/BDS Courses held for the said academic year. However, in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile. In respect of candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs terms of Clause 3.4 above,

the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile. The percentile shall be determined on the basis of highest marks secured in the All India common merit list in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test for admission to MBBS/BDS courses.

5.3. Provided when sufficient number of candidates in the respective categories fail to secure minimum marks as prescribed in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test held for any academic year for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses, the Central Government in consultation with Medical Council of India and Dental Council of India may at its discretion lower the minimum marks required for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks so lowered by the Central Government shall be applicable for the said academic year only.

5.4. The inter-se-merit of candidates for tie-breaking

In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks in the NEET - 2016, the inter-se-merit of such candidates shall be determined in order of preference as follows:

- 5.4.1. Candidates obtaining higher marks in Biology (Botany & Zoology) in the Test.
- 5.4.2. Candidates obtaining higher marks in Chemistry in the Test.
- 5.4.3. Candidates with less number of attempted wrong answers in all the subjects in the Test.
- 5.4.4. Candidates older in age to be preferred.

6. MERIT LIST

Merit list as per NEET score 2016 will be displayed by 6 times the number of seats in each category on the MGIMS website (www.mgims.ac.in). The dates for verification of certificates for selected candidates and waitlisted candidates will also be displayed on the website of MGIMS. The candidates are advised to visit the website daily for updated information.

7. PROCEDURE FOR SELECTION

- 7.1. The eligibility list based on NEET merit is expected to be announced by the 29th August, 2016, on MGIMS website.
- 7.2. The complete list of all the eligible candidates will be prepared category wise and selection will be made strictly on the basis of merit within each category.

- 7.3. Merit list with 6 times the number of seats in each category will be available on our website **www.mgims.ac.in**.
- 7.4. In case the published merit list in any category is exhausted and the seats are still vacant, they will be filled in by the candidates from the complete merit list prepared for all eligible candidates, as above.
- 7.5. The selection against all reserved seats shall be exclusive of the selection of candidate of these categories in general merit category. However, only those candidates will be considered in general merit category who have secured not less than 50% in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together in qualifying examination (10+2).
- 7.6. If the seats remain vacant in any of the categories 2.2 II: a to g (Distribution of Seats, constitutional reservation clause 2.2) and if no further candidate is available in that particular category then, the remaining seats will be filled in from among the candidates of their respective group where the vacancies exist, by inter-se-merit. The groups are as follows:

- 7.6.1.1. Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Caste converted to Buddhism (S.C.)
- 7.6.1.2. Scheduled Tribes including those living out-side specified area (S.T.)

7.6.3.3. Other Backward Classes including SBC* (O.B.C.)

^{*}Hon'ble High Court Mumbai had stayed admission to Special Backward Class (SBC) category as a separate quota and therefore, vide Govt. Circular from Department of Social Welfare, Cultural affairs and Sports no CBC -1095 / WS 1264 / BCD-5 dated 24th October 1995, the persons belonging to SBC are to be considered as OBC candidates and they will be required to produce Non-Creamy Layer certificate.

- 7.6.4. If the seats still remain vacant then: The remaining seats will be filled in from among the common inter-se-merit of the categories 2.2. II: a to g. (constitutional reservation clause 2.2).
- 7.7. In case of Physically Handicapped candidates, if any seat in this 3% quota remains unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% then any such unfilled seat in this 3% quota shall be filled up by persons with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 40% to 50% before the seat is included in the annual sanctioned seats for General Category candidates.

8. VERIFICATION OF CERTIFICATES AND ADMISSION

- 8.1. The selected candidates shall be informed of the date of verification of certificates/ Counselling by website/email/mobile.
- 8.2. The candidate must report by 8.30 AM on the day of verification (not later than 5 P.M. in case of any unavoidable reason with information to the Dean) on the given date. No extension of date & time will be granted when called for admission or verification of certificates.
- 8.3. All candidates must produce following **original certificates along with 3 sets of attested photo copies** at the time of verification of certificates
 - 8.3.1. Nationality Certificate (Annexure 1) issued by District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate / Chief Metropolitan Magistrate or photo copy of Valid Passport duly attested by Dean or Domicile Certificate having endorsed with nationality as Indian on it or Birth certificate having endorsed with nationality as Indian on it. (Annexure 2a and 2b)
 - 8.3.2. Proof of Date of Birth S.S.C. (or equivalent) certificate, College Leaving or Transfer Certificate having date of birth written on it/ birth registration certificate having name of the candidate written on it.
 - 8.3.3. H.S.C. (10+2) examination mark sheet.
 - 8.3.4. Transfer or College leaving certificate from the college last attended.
 - 8.3.5. Attempt certificate showing that the candidate has passed the qualifying examination in first attempt. (Annexure 3)

- 8.3.6. Migration Certificate from the Board should be produced by candidates who have not passed 12th std. or equivalent from Maharashtra State Board or a letter to the effect that there is no provision of issuing migration certificate by that board from competent authority.
- 8.3.7. Migration Certificate from the University last attended. (if applicable)
- 8.3.8. Character certificate from the college/School last attended
- 8.3.9. 4 Passport size photograph
- 8.3.10. NEET Admit card and NEET Marksheet.
- 8.3.11. Softcopy of all their documents in JPG or PDF format below 500 KB; Photo and signature of the candidate files must be below 5 KB.

if applicable

- 8.3.12. Caste Certificate: The candidates claiming reservation of caste under SC / ST / VJ / NT1, 2 or 3 / OBC, including SBC, should produce a caste certificate **signed by SDO or Tehsildar only**. (Annexure 8,9,10)
- 8.3.13. Caste Validity Certificate: Caste validity certificate from the caste certificate scrutiny committee signed by Divisional / District Social Welfare Officer of the division/district from where the caste certificate has been issued. The Validity should be of the caste certificate which is being presented for caste claim.
 - 8.3.13.1. The Caste/Tribe validity Certificate Issuing Authorities in Maharashtra are as mentioned below.
 - 8.3.13.1.1. Divisional Caste Scrutiny Committee of respective Divisional Social Welfare Office for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Caste converts to Buddhism, Vimukta Jati (VJ/DT A), Nomadic Tribes B, C & D and Other Backward Class (including SBC) (annexure 11a)
 - 8.3.13.1.2. Commissioner/Jt. Commissioner, Tribe Scrutiny Committee of respective Region for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribes.

- 8.3.13.2. **Non Maharashtra Candidates**: District Social Welfare Officer / Deputy Collector / Collector or the competent authority of the respective state
 - 8.3.13.2.1. The Validity should of the caste certificate which is being presented for caste claim and should mention the number of the same caste certificate in the vacant space as shown in Annexure 11b for Non Maharashtra candidates specified by *.
 - 8.3.13.2.2. The Caste validity certificate should have its own certificate number and date with round seal of the officer.
- 8.3.13.3. It is mandatory to submit the original caste and caste validity and creamy layer certificate at the time of the verification of original certificates. Admission will not be given without the caste & caste validity and creamy layer certificate.
- 8.3.14. Non Creamy Layer Certificate: An applicant claiming benefit of reservation under the categories VJ, NT-1, NT-2, NT3, OBC/SBC shall be required to submit a certificate in the name of candidate (as per Govt. GR No. सीबीसी 10/2006 प्र.क्र. 15/ मावक dated 30/6/2006) that he/she does not belong to creamy layer (Annexure 12). This certificate should mention clearly that it is valid upto 31st March 2017. The Non Creamy Layer Certificate should be issued by Sub divisional officer.
- 8.3.15. **Rural Certificates**: Candidates claiming the benefit of rural area reservation should produce Rural Claim Certificates I A & B, II, III, **(Annexures: 4 to 7)** and a copy of latest Voter's list showing the names of the parents and village of residence. For details of eligibility under rural reservation please see **clause 3.2**
- 8.3.16. **Physically handicapped Certificate:** A candidate claiming reservation as Physically Handicapped should produce a certificate to this effect as per the details given on **clause 3.4** and **Annexure 13**
- 8.3.17. Educational Gap affidavit on Rs 50 stamp paper by student certified by Executive magistrate / Notary stating that he/she has not taken admission in any Institute / college during the said period if the candidate has passed his/her 12th / HSC or equivalent examination in March 2015 or before and is not

studying / not studied in any institution any time between his/her passing the qualifying examination and date of admission of the present course at this Institute. The affidavit should be from Wardha court.

- 8.3.18. Affidavit on Rs 50 stamp paper from Wardha court certified by Executive magistrate / Notary mentioning the reason for non submission of the first copy of the certificate, if the candidates submits duplicate copy of any certificate.
- 8.3.19. Waitlisted candidates who have taken admission elsewhere should bring the bonafide certificate from the Principal of the Institution in which he/she has taken admission mentioning that the original certificates have been retained by that institution. However, the candidate must produce the attested photocopies of all original certificates at the time of verification. On confirmation of availability of seat at MGIMS the candidate should deposit all the originals within the given time period.
- 8.4. Parent/Guardian (in case parents are not alive) must accompany the candidate as he/she will be required to sign an undertaking.
- 8.5. Original certificates of the candidate will be scrutinized and these along with the attested photocopies will be retained for official purpose.
- 8.6. All candidates admitted to the Institute are required to give an undertaking (on Rs 50 Stamp paper) which has to be countersigned by the candidate's accompanying parents or guardian (Annexure 15).
- 8.7. After ascertaining the eligibility, the candidate will be sent for medical examination to a medical examination board set up by the institute for this purpose. Any candidate found medically unfit shall not be admitted.
- 8.8. Once admitted to this Institute no application for migration to other medical colleges will be entertained.
- 8.9. All admitted candidates must join the college with effect from **16**th **September**, **2016**.
- 8.10. The candidate will automatically lose his/her claim for admission on
 - 8.10.1. Non appearance of the candidate on the time and date informed for verification of certificates (till 5.00 P.M. in unavoidable circumstances with information to dean)

- 8.10.2. Non production of the required certificates/documents on the date of verification / admission as per the format given in this document and/or without proper seals.
- 8.10.3. Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form and/ or suppression of any information.
- 8.10.4. Impersonation and / or Mismatch of signatures / handwriting or thumb impression.
- 8.11. No additional time, what so ever for any reason, will be given for preparing or production any certificates/ documents required for admission as mentioned above. The students should keep all certificates/ documents ready before they are called for verification / admission. However the decision of the advisory committee will be final in such cases.

The candidate selected for admission to MBBS course will deposit the below mentioned amounts (referred to as Security Deposit which shall be adjustable against recovery, if any) either in cash or by way of Demand Draft in favour of 'Kasturba Health Society' payable at Sewagram/Wardha or by a cheque drawn on scheduled Bank at Sewagram/ Wardha (and not in any other form), at the time of his/her admission which shall be retained as Security Deposit as under
 - 9.4.1. An amount of Rs.30,000/- [Rs. Thirty Thousand] which shall continue to be retained as Security Deposit till the time of successful completion of the prescribed Internship Training by the concerned candidate. Such deposit, subject to recovery, if any, may bear the simple interest at the rate applicable to Saving Bank Account as per RBI Norms and as shall be decided by the Society from time to time.
 - 9.4.2. An amount of Rs.70,000/- [Rs. Seventy Thousand] while in case of S.C./S.T./V.J./N.T candidate at Rs.50,000/- [Rs. Fifty Thousand] which shall continue to be retained as Security Deposit till the induction of an authenticated evidence in the Office of Dean, MGIMS in support of successful completion by the concerned students of a service in Area of need for such period as prescribed by Government of Maharashtra, after completing the term of his / her internship training. Such deposit, subject to recovery, if any, may bear the simple interest at the rate applicable to Saving Bank Account as per RBI Norms and as shall be decided by the Society from time to time.
 - 9.4.3. The amounts of Security deposit so retained shall be refunded only on production of Original Receipt, issued at

the time of respective deposits appended to the claim for refund, if any.

9.5. The Student who resigns after the last date specified for admission to MBBS Course normally 30th September of the year of admission or any other date that shall be determined and notified by Medical Council of India; Government of Maharashtra, University of Health Sciences, Nashik; shall be liable to deposit the amount of fees / sum(s) specified in clause 9.1 to 9.4 above for the full term of course i.e. 4 years and 6 months before seeking the return of Original Certificates and / or clearances for his / her disassociation.

10. CANCELLATION

The admission of a candidate is liable to be cancelled if,

- 10.1. He/she does not join the institute within the time limit given.
- 10.2. He/she takes admission and wants to leave the institute after getting admission elsewhere.
- 10.3. He/she does not join the orientation camp without permission.

11. HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

- 11.1. Hostel accommodation is compulsory for both boys and girls, are available within the campus of the Institute.
- 11.2. The Hostel Accommodation is allotted by the Hostel Warden.
- 11.3. Mess/Canteen facilities are available in the campus.

12. LIBRARY

The MGIMS Library has been identified as Resource Library in the Western Region. It functions as Regional Medical Library within HELLIS Network. The Library subscribes to 106 international and 58 National Journals. In view of the importance of medical services, this library functions from 9:00 AM. upto 10.00 PM on all week days. Facility of internet & photocopying of the literature is available in the Library.

III. CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. The general control of students is vested with the Dean.
- Students admitted to MGIMS are expected to Exhibit high standards of academic interest and responsible behavior, befitting professional level of maturity.
- 3. Students admitted to MGIMS are expected to follow the code of conduct as follows
 - a. wearing khadi clothes
 - b. consume vegetarian meals
 - c. eschew smoking, drinking and other intoxicants
 - d. participate in community prayer, shramdan and such other activities as may be prescribed from time to time
 - e. must be free from any prejudice regarding, caste, creed or untouchability
 - f. girl students must tie their hair and boy students should have tidy hair when at work in the college and hospital.
- 4. Residing in the hostels of the Institute is compulsory for all students.
- 5. Students after admission to the Institute are given an Orientation Training Course for a fortnight in Sevagram Ashram for getting sensitized to Gandhian ideology. If it is found that they are unable to adjust themselves to the environment, their admission may be cancelled.
- 6. Attendance in the Social Service camp, whenever it is held is essential, failing which the student may not be allowed to appear in the University Exam.
- 7. Students who do not maintain a satisfactory standard in academics or in the observance of code of conduct or discipline shall neither be allowed to hold office in extracurricular bodies or be eligible for scholarship or given any other assistance.
- 8. Students should maintain 75% attendance with minimum 80% in practical to be eligible to appear in the university examination.
- 9. Permission must be taken from the Dean for any leave or absence from classes or to go out of station. All students must report to the warden before leaving and on return from leave. In case of illness during leave a medical certificate must be sent immediately.
- 10. All illness should be reported to the Warden at the earliest.
- 11. Students must pay for all damages caused by them to books and property of the Institute.

- 12. Fees shall be paid on the date notified by the Dean's office. Mess fees shall be paid in advance for 6 months with term fee. Balance if any, shall be refunded at the time of leaving.
- 13. Ragging in any form is absolutely forbidden and as per the provisions of Maharashtra Act XXXIII known as "Maharashtra Prohibition of ragging Act of 1999", students indulging in ragging can be punished under the Act resulting in suspension, and even expulsion from the Institute and imprisonment.

Prevention of Ragging:

Ragging is a cognizable offence and is forbidden in any form. Anyone indulging in ragging will be punished under the act resulting in suspension, expulsion from the institute and imprisonment. The punishment for ragging will be mentioned in the college leaving certificate.

The Supreme Court has defined the ragging as under:

Clause No.6: Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student. The cause of indulging in ragging is deriving a sadistic pleasure or showing off, power, authority or superiority by the seniors over their juniors or fresher.

Punishable ingredients of Ragging

- Abetment to ragging
- Criminal conspiracy to rag
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- Public nuisance created during ragging
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt
- Wrongful restraint

- Wrongful confinement
- Use of criminal force
- Assault as well as sexual offences or even unnatural offences
- Extortion
- Criminal trespass
- Offences against property
- Criminal intimidation
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- Physical or psychological humiliation

Punishments

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits
- Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension / expulsion from the hostel
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- Fine of Rs 25,000 to Rs 1 lakh.

- Collective Punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- 14. The candidate after taking admission to this Institute shall have to give an undertaking counter signed by his/her parents that he/she shall not indulge in any activity which amounts to ragging and if he/she is found guilty he/she shall be punished as per the disciplinary rules of Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram. (Annexure 14-17)
- 15. Fees shall be paid on the date notified by the Dean's office. After the said date, fees will be acceptable only within a period of one month with a late fee fine as notified. After this period the name of the student will be struck off from the Institute Roll. The student may be readmitted on the payment of **Rs 1000** as readmission fee alongwith clearance of all dues.
- 16. Continuous absence from the classes for over one month without any valid reason will make the student liable to be removed from the institute Rolls. He/she may however be readmitted with valid reason on the payment of **Rs 1000** as readmission fee in addition to clearing all dues.
- 17. As per MUHS, Nashik every student has to attend a minimum of 80% practical and 75% theory classes to be eligible for appear in University examination.

Disclaimer/Warning:

- Student not producing correct original documents with proper seal/s as mentioned in this prospectus by 5 pm on the date of verification / admission, will be disqualified and he/she will automatically lose claim for admission to the MBBS course 2016 of MGIMS, Sevagram, Wardha, Maharashtra.
- 2. 1. INTRODUCTION

Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram

'A Medical College with a Difference'

The Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram is India's first rural medical college. Nestled in the karmabhoomi of Mahatma Gandhi, in Sevagram, this Institute was founded by Dr Sushila Nayar in 1969. It is attached to Kasturba Hospital, which has the distinction of being the only hospital in the country which was started by the Father of the Nation himself.

In the spirit of its Founder, the Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram today is committed to the pursuit of professional excellence by evolving an integrated pattern of medical education and it seeks to provide accessible and affordable health care primarily to underprivileged rural communities.

MGIMS: Quality Medical Education

The institute strives to produce doctors of high clinical competence, professional attitudes and ethical behavior. The Institute believes that Gandhian values and principles are relevant even today and it displays a fierce commitment to advancement of medical education without losing the humane touch.

We, at MGIMS, are conscious of the fact that medical education needs to maintain the right balance in the eternal triangle of 'quality, quantity and equity'. In our perennial quest to attain the perfect blend, we never forget that these three arms are not in conflict, and equity cannot be kept in abeyance. The students at MGIMS are drawn from all parts of the country and come from all kinds of social backgrounds. Every effort is made to acquaint the medical student to the real rural India. Our approach to medical education with the spotlight on rural community oriented education makes our doctors sensitive to the felt needs of the people they would be serving in their future. Our students are expected to adhere to professional norms which include altruism, compassion, empathy, accountability, honesty and integrity.

Unique code of conduct

The students and staff of the Institute adhere to a unique code of conduct, where they are expected to wear hand-woven khadi, participate in shramdan and attend an all-religion prayer every Friday evening. Non-vegetarian food, alcohol and tobacco are taboo.

Soon after admission to the MBBS course, the students live in Gandhiji's Ashram for 15 days, where they are oriented to Gandhian ideology and learn the Gandhian way of life. Drawn from different geographical and cultural backgrounds of the country, this phase helps them get acquainted with each other and respect mutual differences.

Departments and Disciplines

The Institute offers degrees and diplomas in 20 postgraduate disciplines, 19 of which are presently recognized by the Medical Council of India and PhDs in Nine departments is recognized by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik (MUHS). The Institute follows all the norms laid down by the Medical Council of India and by the affiliating University, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for quality medical education. However, to achieve its specific objectives, it has made some curricular innovations which are unique and have stood the test of time now for many years.

The Institute boasts of a well equipped library which is a recognized resource library for HELLIS network in Western India. Students have access to computers and internet. Drawn

from all parts of India, MGIMS has the services of committed, trained full time teachers and physicians, many of whom have won prestigious National and International awards.

Community Orientation and Rural Service

This institute was established to evolve a pattern of medical education to train doctors with a community focus. During the first year, students adopt families in a nearby village and live with the villagers for a fortnight in their surroundings. Here they survey the villagers, understand their social and health related problems and impart health education. The students are made responsible for the health care of the families allotted to them and they follow them up till the end of their medical training. They develop a bond with the villagers and this experience fills them with compassion and a sense of commitment towards serving poor rural communities.

Since 1991, the Institute has asked all its graduates to serve for two years in rural areas. 79 non-governmental organizations have joined hands with the institute to fulfill this dream. Young graduates are posted at these NGOs and provide services to the needy. This rural service is a **mandatory** criterion for applying for post-graduation in this Institute.

The Report of the Task Force on Medical Education of the National Rural Health Mission spells out the need to draw upon MGIMS Sevagram's initiatives and experience in curriculum innovation and rural placement of its graduates. It suggests launching a participatory exercise with MGIMS and other like-minded institutions, so that national guidelines can be formulated. Several such visionary and innovative education strategies which started from the Institute have now been adopted by the government.

Research

The focus of the Institute has been on community based medical research. Quality research has been the hallmark of this rural institute and the large number of funded projects awarded to the various departments is ample testimony to the potential of the researchers. We have consistently received funding from the Indian Council of Medical Research, Department of Science and Technology, Department of Biotechnology, WHO, UNICEF, USAID, Fogarty AIDS Research and Training Program, USA, Canadian Institute of Health Research, Population Health Research Institute, Canada, National Institutes of Health (NIH), National Heart Lung Blood Institute (NHLBI) and other such organizations. Being located in Sevagram has never been a hurdle in acquiring either funds or facilities as the enthusiasm and the dedication of the faculty surpasses all other deterrents. Each year, the large numbers of national and international peer reviewed publications from this Institute provide evidence of excellence in research.

Over the last four decades, the MGIMS faculty has been striving hard to imbibe the philosophy which makes it pursue excellence in academics, healthcare and research, more than mundane needs and money; and to maintain excellence in quality. Today, MGIMS has impressive academic standards and excellent research facilities. In the 46 years of its existence, 2415 doctors have graduated from the hallowed premises of MGIMS. Our alumni, spread far and wide across the globe, continue to bring laurels to their Alma Mater.

KASTURBA HOSPITAL

Rural Health Care

The hospital primarily caters to the rural populace. Almost three-fourths of the patients who visit our hospital come from rural backgrounds. The patient load comes to us not only from Vidarbha in Maharashtra, but also from adjoining parts of Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Chhatisgarh. Kasturba Hospital is a rural institute but it does not lack in any of the modern health care amenities and is able to provide health services at affordable costs. Kasturba Hospital offers the benefits of modern technology with compassionate health care.

The Hospital has state-of-the-art intensive care units in Medicine, Surgery, accidental / emergency, Obstetrics and Gynecology and Pediatrics which provide excellent critical

care. A well equipped hemodialysis unit is available for patients of renal failure. The Sri Satya Sai Accident and Emergency Unit provides succour to patients of trauma. The Institute has the only Blood Component Unit in the district which provides components not only to patients in Kasturba hospital, but also to adjoining private hospitals. Facilities for MRI, CT Scan and Mammography are available. The Institute also has a Linear accelerator, digital subtraction angiography and brachytherapy to its armamentarium, which is used for treatment of cancer patients. A computerized radiotherapy system has also been procured. The Alcohol and Drug De-addiction centre seeks to rehabilitate patients who are addicted to drugs and alcohol. The Pathology, Microbiology and Biochemistry laboratories have in-house facilities to conduct a battery of diagnostic tests. All departments of the hospital are connected by an advanced Hospital Information System. A neurosurgery department has also been started from the year 2009. Joint replacements, spine surgeries are routinely performed.

The Govt. of Maharashtra has initiated Rajiv Gandhi Jeevandayee Arogya Yojana (RGJAY) for improving the access to healthcare for poor patients. This scheme has commenced in Kasturba Hospital since 22nd November 2013.

Community Service and Health Care

The Institute's commitment to the community is well known. Community-based programmes have been consistently implemented to enhance health care services. The Department of Community Medicine has adopted three primary health centres and developed a model of decentralized healthcare delivery at village level through Community-based Organizations and the Panchayati Raj Institutions. It has formed 277 Self-help groups, 12 Kisan Vikas Manch and 88 Kishori Panchayats in the adopted villages. Through innovative strategies, family life education is provided to adolescent girls in all the program villages. The Department of Community Medicine was given the Global Safe Motherhood Award in 2001 by the White Ribbon Alliance for Safe Motherhood and Global Council, USA in recognition of its Suraksha Aichi campaign in nearby villages. WHO has designated the Dr Sushila Nayar School of Public Health at MGIMS as a WHO Collaborating Centre for Research and Training in Community Based Maternal, Newborn and Child Health.

The health insurance scheme of the institute has won several accolades as it seeks to create health consciousness in the community. A villager can insure himself and his family by paying Rs 350 a year and in return he gets 50% subsidy in OPD and indoor bills. In 2013-14, 17292 families (78853 members) around Sevagram volunteered to obtain health insurance from this hospital. Similarly 40 villages were totally insured and 67116 rural people were insured under this scheme. No other medical institution has achieved this kind of coverage so consistently over the years and at so affordable a rate.

AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

The National Rural Health Mission has lauded the 'positive contribution of MGIMS in maternal health activities conducted in partnership with the Government of India'. In 2006, the Institute was awarded the Mahaveer Award for Excellence in the Sphere of Education and Medicine by the Hon'ble President of India. The Institute was bestowed with the National Award for Innovative Hospital and Health Care Management by the Bombay Management Association in 1990. MGIMS has been included among the top 20 best Medical Colleges of the country by the INDIA TODAY survey in May 2008. A survey conducted by the National Medical Journal of India in 1996 ranked the Institute as second in research in Maharashtra. According to a survey (July 2014) by Outlook magazine, MGIMS has been ranked 17th in the list of top 25 medical schools of the country. The monthly Magazine "Careers 360" which is India's largest higher education & career counseling portal and gives bird's eye view of the popular study destinations across the globe has ranked Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences 10th in the list of India's Best Private Medical Colleges based on student's quality, output, impact and learning.

The Institute has been accredited grade A by NAAC in recognition of its academic, research & health care activities.

Over the last four & half decades, the MGIMS faculty has been striving hard to imbibe the philosophy which makes it pursue excellence in academics, healthcare and research, more than mundane needs and money; and to maintain excellence in quality. Today, MGIMS has impressive academic standards and excellent research facilities. In the 46 years of its existence, 2415 doctors have graduated from the hallowed premises of MGIMS. Our alumni, spread far and wide across the globe, continue to bring laurels to their Alma Mater.

Any Institute is recognized not by the pillars of its building, but by its faculty and their achievements. Drawn from all parts of India, MGIMS can boast of eminent full time teachers and physicians, many of whom have won prestigious National and International awards. Five of our faculty have received the Dr. B.C. Roy National award. All Degree and Diploma courses are recognized/permitted by MCI and PhD courses are recognized by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik. The total number of seats available for admission will be determined in accordance with the Medical Council of India regulations.

3. Admission Rules:

- 3.1. These rules shall be called Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram Postgraduate Medical Courses Selection Rules-1985 as amended from time to time.
- 3.2. These rules are subject to alterations, amendments and modifications as may be considered necessary from time to time as per directions from Supreme Court, MCI, MUHS, Nashik and the competent authorities of MGIMS / KHS.
- 3.3 Any issue not dealt in this prospectus will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Competent Authorities of MGIMS/KHS.
- 3.4 In case any ambiguity in interpretation of any the instructions/terms/rules/criteria regarding the determination of eligibility/registration of candidate/information contained herein the interpretation of the Competent Authorities of MGIMS/KHS shall be final and binding.

4. Eligibility Criteria and Requirements for Applying:

- 4.1. A Candidate must be an Indian National.
- 4.2. First preference will be given to a candidate who possesses MBBS degree from Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and has completed one year compulsory rotatory internship. In exceptional cases students from other universities will be considered, subject to MCI rule in case PG seats remain vacant at the end of normal selection cycle.
- 4.3 Must have permanent registration with the State Medical Council / MCI.

4.4

- i) Must have done two years of rural service on or before 31st December 2015. However, those who have done minimum of one year rural service on or before 31st December, 2015 are also eligible to apply for 2016 PG Courses but they must do the remaining period of rural service after completing the P.G. Course to make the total rural service of two years
- ii) The rural service period would not include any period of leave without pay. (See Annexure IA & B)
- iii) During the rural service the candidate must have resided at the place of work.
- iv) First priority shall be given to the candidates who have completed rural Service for which appointment order has been issued by the Dean, MGIMS, Sevagram,
 - a) At a Non Government Voluntary Organization (NGO) working for rural health care and recognized by MGIMS.
 - b) Or at a PHC in Maharashtra for which the first order has been issued by the Dean, MGIMS and subsequent order by the Government authority.

Note: The above candidates must produce certificate of completion of rural service given by the Chief authority of the respective NGO or District Health Officer (DHO) countersigned by Dean, MGIMS as the case may be. (See Annexure IA & B)

- v) Second priority shall be given to the Candidates:
 - a) working/worked in a Primary Health Centre (PHC) / Government Hospital in a rural area and catering to rural population. Posting should be by the respective State Government. The authority to issue certificate of completion of rural service for these candidates will be the concerned District Health Officer (DHO). (See Annexure IB)
 - b) Who have served in the Armed Force Medical Service in the field areas/border areas/ modified field areas/ counter insurgency areas/ operational areas for at least three years. The authority to issue certificate of completion of three years of service for the above will be the Deputy Director General, Armed Forces Service (Planning and Training) on behalf of DGAFMS. (These medical officers of Indian Armed Forces will be made available for full time training at MGIMS, Sevagram and their pay/ allowances will be paid by Indian Armed Forces. They will not claim for any stipend from MGIMS, Sevagram. They will however, make payments towards all the fees and other dues, as prescribed by the MGIMS, Sevagram administration from time to time).
- vi) In case any candidate mentioned under iv a & b above shifts/change place of posting without getting appointed by the Dean MGIMS, Sevagram before the completion of 1 year posting, his/her priority status will automatically shift to second priority (as '5.4 v' above) in the merit list.
- vii) At the time of selection for P.G. Degree / Diploma Course each selected student who has completed only one year or less than one and half year of rural service by 31st December, 2015 shall deposit an amount of Rs. 1 Lakh in cash or local cheque or DD for Rs. 1 Lakhs which will be kept as Security Deposit with Kasturba Health Society in lieu of balance rural service of more than 6 months or one year which has to be completed after completion of the P.G. Degree / Diploma courses. The said amount will be refundable on completion of prescribed rural service along with simple interest to be calculated at the rate applicable at the nationalized bank savings account from time to time.
- viii) The students who have completed one and half year or more but less than two years of rural service by 31st December, 2015 on selection shall deposit an amount of INR 50,000/- in cash or local cheque or DD for Rs. Fifty Thousand which will be kept as Security Deposit with the Kasturba Health Society in lieu of balance rural service of 6 months or less which has to be completed after completion of the P.G. Degree / Diploma courses. The said amount will be refundable on completion of prescribed rural service along with simple interest to be calculated at the rate applicable at the nationalized bank savings account from time to time.

- ix) The candidates who have not completed two years of rural service before 31/12/2015 shall give a bond on Rs 100 stamp paper that total ______ days of rural service is balance. I shall complete this balance rural service after the completion of PG course or service of the institute whatsoever the condition be. I am depositing Rs.1,00,000 / Rs.50,000 in lieu of the balance rural service. I understand that if I fail to complete the balance rural service the above deposited amount will be forfeited.
- x) The candidate shall complete his/her remaining rural service within 24 months of completion of the post graduate course or service of the institute whatsoever the condition be.
- xi) The posting of the students (covered in point '5.4 iv' above) who have to complete the remaining part of rural service at an NGO recognized by MGIMS or at a PHC of Maharashtra has to be given by Dean, MGIMS.
- xii) The posting of the students, covered in point '5.4 v' above, who have to complete the remaining part of rural service at PHC/ Govt. Hospital in a rural area and catering to the rural population should be by the respective State Government with information to Dean, MGIMS, Sevagram.
- xiii) If the selected candidate fails to fulfill the terms and conditions of the executed Bond (covering points vii, viii & ix above), the Institute shall have the right to retain the security deposits of Rs. 1 Lakh or Rs. 50,000/- as the case may be.
- xiv) The candidates who are not able to give such Bonds and deposits of Rs.1 Lakh or Rs. 50,000/- are allowed to have an option to complete two years rural service prior to application for the P.G. Course, in which case they will not be required to give a bond and security deposit but will appear for PG counseling / interview only after the completion of the 2 years rural service.
- After Completion of one year bond period, if the Institution further requires the services of the candidate, that additional period of the service at MGIMS will be considered towards the pending rural service as of 31st December, 2015. However, to fulfill this condition the candidate will have to serve at MGIMS for
 - * 6 months if the pending rural service is up to one month;
 - * one year if pending rural service is more than one month but up to six months
 - * and two years if pending rural service is more than 6 months upto one vear
- 4.5. The students who resign from the opted PG seat resulting in lapse of seat will have to deposit Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lacs only) and in addition they will not be eligible to apply for PG seats for next 3 years in this Institution.
- 4.6. After the successful completion of the post graduate course all the candidates who have taken admission in the post graduate courses of the Institute
 - * shall serve the institute if so required by the Institute for a minimum uninterrupted period of one year (365 days).
 - * At the time of admission to PG Degree / Diploma Course each selected student will be required to sign a bond to the effect that he/she will serve the institute for a period of one year after the successful completion of the post graduate course and join within 15 days of from the date of the order issued by the authorities of the Institute.

- * Failing to serve the institute accordingly to the satisfaction of the Authorities of MGIMS he/she will be required to pay Rs. 50,00,000/-(Rupees fifty lacs only) in cash for the default.
- * The in service candidates will have to produce the no objection certificate from their respective Governments that they will be allowed to serve in the institute for one year after completion of the P.G.course.
- 4.7. The applicants who are already admitted or registered for P.G. Degree/ Diploma of the MUHS or any other University or Institution must have had resigned and got relieved from the respective courses in which they were admitted before they appear for counseling of PG admissions at MGIMS.

5. Non Eligibility:

The candidate will be declared non-eligible

- 5.1. If he / she does not fulfill any of the criteria as mentioned in 4 above.
- 5.2 If he / she is working in the NGO/PHC recognized by the Institute but is not officially posted there by the Dean of MGIMS, Sevagram.]
- 5.3 Candidates who have not obtained MMC/MCI registration.
- 5.4 Candidates who had been admitted to PG course and resigned/left/not joined which resulted in lapse of a seat.
- 5.5 Candidates who are previously registered and are pursuing/have completed the PG degree/diploma course or have obtained PG degree/diploma in same subject.
- 5.6 Candidates who are registered for PG degree / diploma and have not passed the course.
- 5.7 Candidate having more than three extra attempts in the University examination during entire MBBS course.

* Applicants belonging to Special Backward Category: Hon'ble High Court Mumbai had stayed admission to Special Backward Category as a separate quota and therefore, vide Government Circular from Social Welfare, Cultural Affairs and Sports Department No. CBC-1095/WS/264/BCW-5 dated 24th

October 1995, the persons belonging to Special Backward Category (SBC) are to be considered as OBC candidates.

6.1. 1 As detailed below seats remaining vacant from various categories under constitutional reservation will be filled in by inter-se merit of that particular group as per the Government regulations and if the seats still remain vacant they will be offered first to students of any of the reservation category and then to Open category students as per merit.

Note: The candidate should have claimed the constitutional reservation in the original application form. No request for the change of category under which applied for will be entertained after the submission of application to the Institute. Caste claim will not be accepted if requisite caste certificate & caste validity certificate is not submitted at the time of verification of certificates.

6.2. Physically Handicapped (PH):

- 6.2.1 As per G.R. No. SRV-1997/P.K.12/97/16-A dated 2.5.1998 Three percent (3%) seats are reserved for Physically Handicapped candidates (locomotory disability of lower limbs). Persons who are visually handicapped, hearing disabled and loco motor disability involving upper limb are not eligible to apply.
- 6.2.2 As per MCI guidelines letter no. MCI-34(1)/2003-Med/11773, dated 14/7/2003 persons having 'locomotory disability of lower limbs ranging between 50-70% are eligible to take admission to Health Science Courses. But those with more than 70% disability of lower limbs will not be eligible for admission in any category or Open seat.
- 6.2.3 In case any seat in this 3% quota remains unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 50% to 70% then any such unfilled seat in this 3% quota shall be filled up by persons with locomotory disability of lower limbs between 40% to 50% before they are included in the annual sanctioned seats for General Category candidates (No. MCI.18 (1)/2008-Med./54470 dated 25th March, 2009).
- 6.2.4 For seeking the benefit of reservation under PH the candidate should submit proof of his/her disability to the MGIMS scrutiny committee at the time of verification of Certificates by way of a certificate in prescribed proforma from Civil Surgeon of a District Hospital/Medical Board/Medical Superintendent of a Government Medical College/Hospital in Maharashtra;

- or from the Director of All India Institute of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Haji Ali, Mumbai;. (Format given in the Annexure: II) The certificate should have been issued within three months prior to presenting his application for seeking admission. In other words, the last valid disability certificate of the candidate from a Medical Board should not be more than three months old from the date of submitting his or her application for seeking admission in the reserved category for disabled candidates. (eg: If the last date of submission of application is 14th December, 2015 then this certificate should have been issued on or later than 14th September, 2015)
- 6.2.5 Verification of the disability and certificate will be carried out by Medical Board of the Institute at the time of admission at MGIMS. The Medical Board after ascertaining his/her disability will also certify that the candidate is physically fit to undergo the course, despite his/her disability.

7. Procedure for Applying for P.G. Admission:

- 7.1. Before applying, the candidates are advised to go through the Prospectus available on the website www.mgims.ac.in and the instructions and rules given therein very carefully and fill in the application form completely. Incomplete applications will not be considered and no correspondence will be entertained.
- 7.2. Applications for admission to the course are required to be filled by down loading application form from the website www.mgims.ac.in and the hard copy/printout of the filled application form should be submitted to the Dean's office along with Rs. 2000/- in cash or a demand draft of Rs. 2000/- drawn in favour of 'Dean, MGIMS, Sevagram'.
- 7.3. The print out/hard copy of the filled in application, complete in all respects, accompanied with all the relevant documents and Fee of Rs.2000/- should reach the Office of Dean, Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram-442102, Wardha (Dist), Maharashtra on or before 28/12/2015. The applications received after the closing date will not be considered and no correspondence will be entertained.
- 7.4. The allotment of the Post Graduate seat depends on the merit and the availability of seat in the subject at the time of the counseling.
- 7.5. No request for the change of category under which applied for will be entertained after the submission of application to the Institute.
- 7.6. Candidates in employment must forward their application through proper channel.
- 7.7. Any candidate giving false information in any form or in respect to educational qualification, experience, rural service etc. will be disqualified for admission and legal action may be taken.

- vi. College Leaving Certificate for those who have not done MBBS from MGIMS
- vii Attempt certificate of First Professional, Second Professional and Final Professional (Part I & Part II) MBBS
- viii Copy of Gazette for change in name (if applicable)
- ix Migration Certificate for the candidates of Universities other than Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik.
- x Educational Gap (After qualifying Degree) Affidavit by student certified by Executive magistrate / Notary (See Annexure IX) (if applicable)
- xi. Certificate from Head of Institute showing that the Medical College / Institute from which the candidate has passed MBBS Examination is recognized by Medical Council of India
- xii. Certificate of Completion of Rural Service (as per the formats given in the **Annexures I A & B**
- xiii. Posting letter in case of candidates who have served / serving in PHC / Government Rural Hospital from District Health Officer (DHO)
- xiv. Relieving / No objection Certificate for in-service candidates
- xv. Affidavit on Rs 100/- stamp paper stating reason for submission of duplicate copy of any document (See Annexure VIII) (if applicable).

If Applicable

- xvi. **Caste Certificate**: The candidates claiming reservation of caste under SC /ST / VJ/ NT1, 2 or 3 / OBC, including SBC, should produce a caste certificate signed by Sub Divisional Officer / Tehsildar/ equally competent officer authorized to issue certificate as per the format given in **Annexure IV (A, B & C)**.
- xvii. **Caste Validity Certificate**: Caste validity certificate from the caste certificate scrutiny committee signed by Divisional / District Social Welfare Officer of the division/district from where the caste certificate has been issued.

Please note that

- 1. The caste Validity certificate is meant for validating the caste certificate and it mentions the number of caste certificate. Therefore the caste certificate which is being presented for caste claim should have the number which the caste validity certificate is validating. (Annexure V)

- IF ORIGINAL CASTE, CASTE VALIDITY OR NON CREAMY LAYER CERTIFICATES FROM DULY MENTIONED AUTHORITIES WITH PROPER SEAL/S AND DISPATCH NUMBER ARE NOT SUBMITTED / PRODUCED BY THE CANDIDATES CLAIMING ADMISSION UNDER CONSTITUTIONAL RESERVATION AT THE TIME OF VERIFICATION, THE CANDIDATES OPTING FOR RESERVATION CATEGORIES SHALL BE CONSIDERED AS OPEN CATEGORY CANDIDATES.
- CLAIM UNDER PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED CATEGORY SHOULD BE MADE IN THE APPLICATION FORM SUPPORTED BY THE PROPER PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED CERTIFICATE AS PER PROSPECTUS.
- NO ADDITIONAL TIME WILL BE GIVEN FOR PREPARING, PRODUCTION OF ANY CERTIFICATE / DOCUMENT, ONCE CALLED FOR VERIFICATION / COUNSELLING. HOWEVER, THE DECISION OF THE SELECTION COMMITTEE IN THIS REGARD WILL BE FINAL AND BINDING.

9. Preparation of Merit List:

- 9.1. The merit list of the candidates will be prepared by the Dean, Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram after the last date of receipt of applications and notified on the college notice board at a later date.
- 9.2. Any objection or representation received within 6 hours of the notification of the merit list would be considered by the Dean who shall, if necessary, make modifications after placing the objections or representations before the P.G.

Selection Committee and the final merit list will again be notified on the college notice board before the counseling.

10. Determination of Merit:

- 10.1. The Merit will be determined by adding up the marks obtained at First Professional, Second Professional and Final Professional (Part I & Part II) MBBS examination along with the actual marks obtained in the subject in which the candidate has applied.
- 10.2. For candidates coming from any University other than Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik (MUHS), the marks obtained will be compiled after conversion to the subject wise pattern of the marks of MUHS, Nasik.

For example if a candidate has secured 180 marks out of maximum of 300 marks allotted to the subject by 'x' University from where he/she has graduated & if the maximum marks of this subject in Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik are 400 the marks for the tabulation of merit would be:

- 10.3. For the purpose of calculation in the subjects which are not separate at the M.B.B.S. level, the marks of the main subject under which the allied subject have been included as per Medical Council of India will be taken. For example marks obtained in Surgery for allied subjects, like Radiology, Anesthesiology & Orthopedics and marks obtained in Medicine for allied subjects like Psychiatry & Skin & VD.
- 10.4. The total marks obtained after calculation as mentioned above (12.1 to 12.3) will be tabulated for merit after making the following additions or deductions as the case may be:
 - a) 10 Additional marks will be awarded to each candidate who has completed rural service for 24 months or more by 31st December, 2015.
 - b) 7 Additional marks will be awarded to each candidate who has completed 18 months of rural service but less than 24 months by 31st December, 2015. For each extra attempt, a deduction of 5% of the maximum marks of the subject in which candidate has failed will be made from the above aggregate.
 - c) 10 additional marks will be added in the total marks of each candidate who has completed one year compulsory rotatory internship from Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram.

10.5. Tie Breaker:

In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks the inter-se-merit of such candidates will be determined in the order of preference as under:

- 1. The candidate with higher aggregate marks (converted into percentage) at First, Second and Third M.B.B.S. Examination (Part-I & II) taken together shall be preferred. If the tie still persists,
- 2. The candidate with higher aggregate marks (converted into percentage) at Third M.B.B.S. Examination (Part-I & II) will be preferred. If the tie still persists,

- 3. The candidate with higher aggregate marks (converted into percentage) at Second M.B.B.S. Examination will be preferred. If the tie still persists,
- 4. An older candidate will be preferred over a younger candidate.
- 5. While considering I, II, III MBBS marks and aggregate for above purpose, grace marks and/or NSS marks will not be taken into account.

11. Verification of original certificates and allotment of seat:

- 11.1. All the candidates should be present at the Committee Room of the Dean's Office on the date & time given in the admission notice for the current year with original certificates and one set of attested photo copy of the certificates.
- 11.2. The Selection shall be on the basis of merit prepared with M.B.B.S. marks and personal appearance at the time of counseling. The above rules covered in items numbers 5 to 12 shall be applicable to all selections.
- 11.3. The Selection Committee shall consist of:

i. President, Kasturba Health Society - Chairman

ii. Dean, MGIMS - Member Secretary

iii. Medical Superintendent, Kasturba Hospital - Member

iv. Head of the concerned Department - Member

In the absence of the President, the Dean will be in the Chair.

The quorum for the meeting shall be of three members

This Committee will call candidates in person for Counseling and verification of original documents.

- 11.4. Selection will not solely depend on the merit in the examinations but shall be subject to the final selection of the candidate by the selection committee. However, the counseling with the selection committee does not carry any marks.
- 11.5. i) A candidate absent at the time of the first counseling will not be considered for admission and will not be eligible for any subsequent counseling for that academic year.
 - ii) A candidate who is present but does not opt for a seat (if available) in the first counseling will not be eligible for any subsequent counseling for that academic year.
 - iii) If any candidate to whom a seat has been allotted in the 1st round does not join the college and course seat so allotted, it will be presumed that such a candidate is not interested in the admission process and for all further round(s) of admission; such candidate shall not be considered for allotment of any seat whatsoever. The seat so allotted to such a candidate who does not join, will be presumed to be a vacant seat as on and from the next date after the date set out as the last date for joining the college in terms of such allotment. Such a vacant seat will be allotted to any other candidate on merit in the next round of counseling.
 - iv) It is made clear that even if a candidate to whom a seat has been allotted in the 1st round wants a betterment of his/her choice, such a candidate must initially accept the allotment and join the college by completing the necessary formalities as set out by these Rules, failing which such a candidate will be left out of the entire admission process of the current academic year 2016- 2017.

- 11.6 Failure of the candidate in making full and correct statements in the application form and/or suppression of any information would lead to disqualification of the candidate, even at later date. Such a candidate will be debarred from the entire selection process.
- 11.7 It is responsibility of every candidate to submit proper documents. Any attempt to submit documents which are not genuine will lead to cancellation of the admission of the candidate, forfeiture of the fees, deposits and expulsion of the candidate from the college by the Competent Authority or by his authorised official. The name of such candidate/s shall be deleted from the Merit List and he/she will not be eligible for further rounds of the selection process and will be debarred from the selection process. All such action against the candidate if leads to lapse of seat then additional penalty of Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lacs Only) will be recovered from the candidates. If deemed fit even criminal proceeding may be initiated by the Competent Authority against such candidates/their parents.
- 11.8 If any candidate/ authorised representative or person accompanying is found obstructing the counseling and/or admission process, or trying to influence in unlawful manner/creating nuisance, the candidate shall be liable for disqualification from the process of selection and appropriate legal action will be taken. The decision taken by the Competent Authority in this respect shall be final and binding.
- 11.9 The registration once granted is valid only if the teacher and the Dean are satisfied about regularity, diligent pursuance of studies by the student as well as good conduct.
- 11.10 All candidates selected for admission shall be subject to the disciplinary rules of the Institution, MUHS, Nashik, MCI and Government.
- 11.11 Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik shall take the decision regarding eligibility, enrollment and registration and granting of the term of selected candidates. The selection of a candidate by the Competent Authority at a later date does not place any onus to accord approval for grant of term.
- 11.12 Canvassing directly or indirectly for the allotment of seat would disqualify the candidate for admission. Influencing the staff by unfair means, will lead to cancellation of allotted seat and such candidate will also face disqualification for appearance in the subsequent years.
- 11.13 A candidate selected for postgraduate course will not be allowed to change subject/college/institute on mutual basis as per the MCI rules/MUHS regulations.
- 11.14 In all matters regarding admission and interpretation of the rules for P.G. Selection the decision of the Selection Committee shall be final.
- 11.15 All matters of dispute will be legally dealt within the jurisdiction of Wardha Court.

12. Preference:

- 12.1. First preference will be given to the Institutional Candidates. Institutional Candidates mean candidates who have passed the M.B.B.S. examination from Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram.
- 12.2. Candidates from outside the Institute will be considered after admission of the Institutional Candidates, provided they fulfill all the eligibility criteria as given in Item number 5.

13. Duration & Training of Courses:

- 13.1. It will be a three years residency system for degree course and two years for Diploma Course (as per MCI rules). Degree course after Diploma in the same subject will also be for two years.
- 13.2. The period of training as a Postgraduate student will be a full time assignment and the candidate shall put in regular attendance for the period prescribed by Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram to the entire satisfaction of his / her guide and Head of the Department. It is mandatory for all Post Graduate students to attend minimum 80% of training during each year starting from 1st May to 30th April. Any candidate who fails to fulfill the said criteria, term of such candidates shall be extended till such time, the said candidate fulfills 80 % attendance as specified above.
- 13.3. In case students' term is extended they will have to complete the extended term with required attendance. However, stipend will be paid for only 36 months in case of Degree and 24 months in case of diploma.
- 13.4. Every Candidate who joins M.D. /M.S. course is required to submit a plan of thesis approved by the Institutes Ethics Committee within 6 months of his/her joining the course or by the last date prescribed by MUHS, Nasik, whichever is earlier. He/she is required to submit the final thesis after completion of 2 1/2 year of his/her joining the course or as per the requirement of the University.
- 13.5. The candidate will be eligible to take the M.D./M.S. final examination only after approval of his/her thesis by the University.
- 13.6. All candidates are required to put in 6 complete terms of training in the concerned department after registration for degree and 4 terms in Diploma courses.
- 13.7. All the Students admitted to the post Graduate course shall maintain a log book which is mandatory as per the affiliating university, Maharashtra University of health Sciences, Nashik. The aim of the log-book is to evaluate the training program on a day to day basis so as to ascertain the eligibility of the candidate to appear for the final university examination for the degree / diploma. Following are the objectives of maintaining the log book:
 - 1. To help the Resident to maintain the day to day record of work done by him / her.
 - To enable the faculty to have first hand information about the work done by the resident and suggest improvement for better performance.
 - To confirm the participation in post graduate training activities like ward rounds, presentation of scientific articles at journal club, case clinics, post graduate seminars, clinical symposia and book reviews.
 - 4. Assessing the skills acquired by residents in patient care, teaching and research.
 - 5. To confirm level and degree of participation in research activities.

6. ASSESSMENT OF RESIDENCY

The resident will maintain a record of work which is to be verified by the Unit Head / In-charge of the activity and Head of the department on term basis. Based on the record of the work, the Head of department will certify the satisfactory completion of training annually under intimation to the Head of the Institution.

- 14.4 **Cancellation:** If any candidate cancels his/her admission, an amount of Rs. 5,500/- (Admission Fee Rs. 5000/-, Medical checkup fee Rs. 500/-) as Processing fee will be deducted. Hostel & Mess charges will be deducted as per use.
- Refund: After completion of PG diploma/degree course, original receipt will be compulsorily needed for refund of caution and security money. No refund will be given without the original receipt.

15. Leave:

The registered P.G. Students can avail leave as follows:

- 15.1. Those registered for P.G. Degree/diploma courses can avail 15 days Earned leave and 15 days Casual leave for each year starting from 1st May to 30th April. Casual leave cannot be carried over from one year (as specified above) to another year, however earned leave can be carried over but cannot be encashed by taking accumulated earned leave at the end of P.G. Course as preparatory leave.
- 15.2. Thus a candidate registered for P.G. degree course can avail a total of 90 days leave during the three years course, whereas the candidate registered for P.G. Diploma course can avail a total of 60 days leave during the entire course of two years. This leave has to be availed within the prescribed duration of the P.G. course i.e. up to the 30th April of the last year of the course. It cannot be carried over after that. Any candidate who avails leave more than that

- specified above, the total tenure will be extended by one or more terms as the case may be.
- 15.3. Normally Casual leave for more than 3 days at a time will not be sanctioned.
- 15.4. There is no provision of sick leave, special leave, maternity leave and any preparation leave before examination.

16. Hostel Accommodation:

- 16.1. Hostel accommodation is available within the campus of the Institute.
- 16.2. The Hostel Accommodation is allotted by the Hostel Warden.
- 16.3. Mess/Canteen facilities are available in the campus.
- 16.4. Married P.G. hostel accommodation is available for the married P.Gs who are living with their spouses. The charges for Married P.G. hostel are Rs. 5,550/month with extra charges for electricity and water.

17. Library:

The MGIMS Library has been identified as Resource Library in the Western Region. It functions as Regional Medical Library within HELLIS Network. The Library subscribes to 151 international and 61 National Journals. In view of the importance of medical services, this library functions from 8:00 AM. upto 10.00 PM on all week days. Facility of internet & photocopying of the literature is available in the Library.

18. Discipline & Code of Conduct:

- 18.1 Students admitted to MGIMS are expected to Exhibit high standards of academic interest and responsible behavior, befitting professional level of maturity.
- 18.2 The students are required to follow the following code of conduct of the institute.
 - i. Wearing Khadi
 - ii. Consume only vegetarian food.
 - iii. Eschew smoking, drinking and use of all other intoxicants.
 - iv Participate in Community Prayer, Shramdan & such other community activities as may be prescribed from time to time.
 - v. Be free from any prejudice regarding, caste, creed or untouchability.
- 18.3 If any student is found guilty of breach of discipline or code of conduct or violating any other rule of the Institute he/she will be liable to disciplinary action which could be cancellation of registration and expulsion from the Institute.
- 18.4 If any student is found engaged or engaging in any activity against female / male gender of any age which would fall within the purview of offence under provisions of Indian Penal Code, Protection of Children from Sexual Offence Act or any other type of law in existence, he would require to face disciplinary proceedings and he or she can be expelled from the Institute and his/her registration would be cancelled. Besides this, report would be lodged against him/her to police for prosecution.
- 18.5 If any student is found engaged or engaging in any type of act which would fall within the purview of offence under information and technology Act or if he uses electronic equipments, mobile, lap-top or any other mode of communication in any form which would fall within the purview of offence, in that case for such act, report would be lodged against him by the institute to police and disciplinary

action would be taken which may result in cancellation of registration and or expulsion from the Institute.

- 18.6 Students must pay for all damages caused by them to books and property of the Institute.
- 18.7 Fees shall be paid on the date notified by the Dean's office. Mess and electricity charges shall be paid in advance for 6 months with term fee. Balance if any, shall be refunded at the time of leaving.
- 18.8 Continuous absence from the duties allotted by the guide/HOD for more than one month without permission or any valid reason would make the student liable for removal from the college rolls.
- 18.9 In case of dispute in the matter of allotment of seat/course/institution or any other matter pertaining to the provisional selection or cancellation of admission, the decision of the Competent Authority shall be final and binding.
- 18.10 Legal Jurisdiction: All disputes pertaining to the PG selection process shall fall within the jurisdiction of Wardha Court only.
- 18.11 **Prevention of Ragging**: Ragging is a cognizable offence and is forbidden in any form. Anyone indulging in ragging will be punished under the act resulting in suspension, expulsion from the institute and imprisonment. The punishment for ragging will be mentioned in the college leaving certificate.

The Supreme Court has **defined the ragging** as under:

Clause No.6 : Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student. The cause of indulging in ragging is deriving a sadistic pleasure or showing off, power, authority or superiority by the seniors over their juniors or freshers.

Punishable ingredients of Ragging:-

- Abetment to ragging;
- Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- Public nuisance created during ragging;
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- Wronaful restraint;
- Wrongful confinement;
- Use of criminal force;
- Assault as well as sexual offences or even unnatural offences;
- Extortion:
- Criminal trespass;
- Offences against property;
- Criminal intimidation;
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- Physical or psychological humiliation.

Punishments:

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ exam or other evaluation Process.
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- Fine of Rs. 25,000/- to Rs.1 lakh.
- Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

19. Awards:

- 1. Shri Sumat Prasad Parmeshwari Das Jain Memorial Silver Medal for topping the merit list for the selection of postgraduate students among the regular batch for the year under consideration.
- 2. Sagar Gupta memorial Award of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) for topping the merit list among the students admitted for postgraduate course in Surgery for the year under consideration.
- 3. Sh. Kulbhushan and Urmil Vohra cash award for standing second in the merit list among the students admitted for postgraduate course in Surgery for the year under consideration.
- 4. Smt Urmil Vohra Silver medal and cash award for the P.G. Student who tops the merit list among the Students admitted for Postgraduate course in department of Medicine for the year under consideration.
- 5. Shri Gurpur Narsimha Pai and Shri Mohan Chandra Pant Memorial Silver Medal and cash prize of **Rs.**3000 to the author of the best post graduate thesis in the Department of Medicine.

THE WHITE COAT ARMY

An MGIMS undergraduate students' initiative against tobacco and alcohol

In July 2015, a few undergraduate students from 2012, 13 and 14 batches of MGIMS formed a team called 'The White Coat Army' under the guidance of Dr Dharav Shah, an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at MGIMS. The group's objective was to increase awareness about tobacco and alcohol addiction among the masses.

The main questions that the group addresses are:

- Causes of alcohol and tobacco attributable deaths, other than liver damage and cancer.
- How addictions impair the quality of life even when the person is still alive
- Addressing common misconceptions such as: 'It is better to start taking little amount of alcohol to improve one's health'.
- How addictions actually increase stress in the long run
- The addictive nature of alcohol and tobacco-. Why it is advisable to not touch the first drink.
- Giving hope that quitting addiction is possible- Informing about the help available through Psychiatry Department and Alcoholics Anonymous. Giving few tips on quitting.
- How to help family members who are addicted

What does the White Coat Army do?

- The White Coat Army started conducting awareness campaigns for patients and their relatives who visited our hospital in the departments of Medicine, Pediatrics, Obstetrics & Gynecology and Psychiatry.
- The team members conducted 3-4 awareness talks per week in rotation and thus covered 1147 people in one month.
- The team has also conducted two sessions for the newly admitted students of 2015 batch, focusing mainly on ways to deal with peer pressure and stress management.
- Four team members expanded their work and have conducted sessions for school children in their respective hometowns, covering around 300 students.
- The team has conducted a survey assessing the role of alcohol ban implementation and its efficacy in the Indirawadi area of Wardha.
- The team has recently started visiting nearby villages and has organized campaigns in Ekurli and Padegaon, including a special session on World Anti Tobacco Day.

Evaluation of work

The team used retro-pre questionnaires to assess the impact of their work on the audience as well as the participating volunteers. The results obtained are summarized below.

INTRODUCTION

Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram

'A Medical College with a Difference'

The Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram is India's first rural medical college. Nestled in the karmabhoomi of Mahatma Gandhi, in Sevagram, this Institute was founded by Dr Sushila Nayar in 1969. It is attached to Kasturba Hospital, which has the distinction of being the only hospital in the country which was started by the Father of the Nation himself.

In the spirit of its Founder, the Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram today is committed to the pursuit of professional excellence by evolving an integrated pattern of medical education and it seeks to provide accessible and affordable health care primarily to underprivileged rural communities.

MGIMS: Quality Medical Education

The institute strives to produce doctors of high clinical competence, professional attitudes and ethical behavior. The Institute believes that Gandhian values and principles are relevant even today and it displays a fierce commitment to advancement of medical education without losing the humane touch.

We, at MGIMS, are conscious of the fact that medical education needs to maintain the right balance in the eternal triangle of 'quality, quantity and equity'. In our perennial quest to attain the perfect blend, we never forget that these three arms are not in conflict, and equity cannot be kept in abeyance. The students at MGIMS are drawn from all parts of the country and come from all kinds of social backgrounds. Every effort is made to acquaint the medical student to the real rural India. Our approach to medical education with the spotlight on rural community oriented education makes our doctors sensitive to the felt needs of the people they would be serving in their future. Our students are expected to adhere to professional norms which include altruism, compassion, empathy, accountability, honesty and integrity.

Unique code of conduct

The students and staff of the Institute adhere to a unique code of conduct, where they are expected to wear hand-woven khadi, participate in shramdan and attend an all-religion prayer every Friday evening. Non-vegetarian food, alcohol and tobacco are taboo.

Soon after admission to the MBBS course, the students live in Gandhiji's Ashram for 15 days, where they are oriented to Gandhian ideology and learn the Gandhian way of life. Drawn from different geographical and cultural backgrounds of the country, this phase helps them get acquainted with each other and respect mutual differences.

Departments and Disciplines

The Institute offers degrees and diplomas in 20 postgraduate disciplines, 19 of which are presently recognized by the Medical Council of India and PhDs in Nine departments is recognized by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik (MUHS). The Institute follows all the norms laid down by the Medical Council of India and by the affiliating University, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for quality medical education.

However, to achieve its specific objectives, it has made some curricular innovations which are unique and have stood the test of time now for many years.

The Institute boasts of a well equipped library which is a recognized resource library for HELLIS network in Western India. Students have access to computers and internet. Drawn from all parts of India, MGIMS has the services of committed, trained full time teachers and physicians, many of whom have won prestigious National and International awards.

Community Orientation and Rural Service

This institute was established to evolve a pattern of medical education to train doctors with a community focus. During the first year, students adopt families in a nearby village and live with the villagers for a fortnight in their surroundings. Here they survey the villagers, understand their social and health related problems and impart health education. The students are made responsible for the health care of the families allotted to them and they follow them up till the end of their medical training. They develop a bond with the villagers and this experience fills them with compassion and a sense of commitment towards serving poor rural communities.

Since 1991, the Institute has asked all its graduates to serve for two years in rural areas. 75 non-governmental organizations have joined hands with the institute to fulfill this dream. Young graduates are posted at these NGOs and provide services to the needy. This rural service is a mandatory criterion for applying for post-graduation in this Institute.

The Report of the Task Force on Medical Education of the National Rural Health Mission spells out the need to draw upon MGIMS Sevagram's initiatives and experience in curriculum innovation and rural placement of its graduates. It suggests launching a participatory exercise with MGIMS and other like-minded institutions, so that national guidelines can be formulated. Several such visionary and innovative education strategies which started from the Institute have now been adopted by the government.

Research

The focus of the Institute has been on community based medical research. Quality research has been the hallmark of this rural institute and the large number of funded projects awarded to the various departments is ample testimony to the potential of the researchers. We have consistently received funding from the Indian Council of Medical Research, Department of Science and Technology, Department of Biotechnology, WHO, UNICEF, USAID, Fogarty AIDS Research and Training Program, USA, Canadian Institute of Health Research, Population Health Research Institute, Canada, National Institutes of Health (NIH), National Heart Lung Blood Institute (NHLBI) and other such organizations.

Being located in Sevagram has never been a hurdle in acquiring either funds or facilities as the enthusiasm and the dedication of the faculty surpasses all other deterrents. Each year, the large numbers of national and international peer reviewed publications from this Institute provide evidence of excellence in research.

Over the last four decades, the MGIMS faculty has been striving hard to imbibe the philosophy which makes it pursue excellence in academics, healthcare and research, more than mundane needs and money. Today, MGIMS has impressive academic standards and excellent research facilities. In the 46 years of its existence, 2415 doctors have graduated from the hallowed premises of MGIMS. Our alumni, spread far and wide across the globe, continue to bring laurels to their Alma Mater.

Rural Health Care

The hospital primarily caters to the rural populace. Almost three-fourths of the patients who visit our hospital come from rural backgrounds. The Hospital has state-of-the-art intensive care units in Medicine, Accident & Emergency, Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynecology and Pediatrics which provide excellent critical care. A well equipped hemodialysis unit is available for patients of renal failure. The Sri Satya Sai Accident and Emergency Unit provides succour to patients of trauma. The Institute has the only Blood Component Unit in the district which provides components not only to patients in Kasturba hospital, but also to adjoining private hospitals. Facilities for MRI, CT Scan and Mammography are available. The Institute also has a Linear accelerator, digital subtraction angiography and brachytherapy to its armamentarium, which is used for treatment of cancer patients. A computerized radiotherapy system has also been procured. The Alcohol and Drug De-addiction centre seeks to rehabilitate patients who are addicted to drugs and alcohol. The Pathology, Microbiology and Biochemistry laboratories have in-house facilities to conduct a battery of diagnostic tests. All departments of the hospital are connected by an advanced Hospital Information System. A neurosurgery department has also been started from the year 2009. Joint replacements, spine surgeries are routinely performed.

The Govt. of Maharashtra has initiated Rajiv Gandhi Jeevandayee Arogya Yojana (RGJAY) for improving the access to healthcare for poor patients. This scheme has commenced in Kasturba Hospital since 22nd November 2013.

Community Service and Health Care

The Institute's commitment to the community is well known. Community-based programmes have been consistently implemented to enhance health care services. The Department of Community Medicine has adopted three primary health centres and developed a model of decentralized healthcare delivery at village level through Community-based Organizations and the Panchayati Raj Institutions. It has formed 276 Self-help groups, 12 Kisan Vikas Manch and 90 Kishori Panchayats in the adopted villages. Through innovative strategies, family life education is provided to adolescent girls in all the program villages. The Department of Community Medicine was given the Global Safe Motherhood Award in 2001 by the White Ribbon Alliance for Safe Motherhood and Global Council, USA in recognition of its Suraksha Aichi campaign in nearby villages. WHO has designated the Dr Sushila Nayar School of Public Health at MGIMS as a WHO Collaborating Centre for Research and Training in Community Based Maternal, Newborn and Child Health.

The health insurance scheme of the institute has won several accolades as it seeks to create health consciousness in the community. A villager can insure himself and his family by paying Rs 350 a year and in return he gets 50% subsidy in OPD and indoor bills. In 15, 17755 families (81069 members) around Sevagram volunteered to obtain health insurance from this hospital. Similarly 40 villages were totally insured and 75281 rural people were insured under this scheme. No other medical institution has achieved this kind of coverage so consistently over the years and at so affordable a rate.

AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

The National Rural Health Mission has lauded the 'Positive contribution of MGIMS in maternal health activities conducted in partnership with the Govt. of India'. In 2006, the Institute was awarded the Mahaveer Award for Excellence in the Sphere of Education and Medicine by

the Hon'ble President of India. The Institute was bestowed with the National Award for Innovative Hospital & Health Care Management by the Bombay Management Association in 1990. MGIMS has been included among the top 20 best Medical Colleges of the country by the INDIA TODAY survey in May 2008. A survey conducted by the National Medical Journal of India in 1996 ranked the Institute as second in research in Maharashtra. According to a survey (July 2014) by Outlook magazine, it has been ranked 17th in the list of top 25 medical schools of the country.

The Institute has been accredited grade A by NAAC in recognition of its academic, research & health care activities.

Over the last four and half decades, the MGIMS faculty has been striving hard to imbibe the philosophy which makes it pursue excellence in academics, healthcare and research, more than mundane needs and money; and to maintain excellence in quality. Today, MGIMS has impressive academic standards and excellent research facilities. In the 46years of its existence, 2415 doctors have graduated from the hallowed premises of MGIMS. Our alumni, spread far and wide across the globe, continue to bring laurels to their Alma Mater.

Any Institute is recognized not by the pillars of its building, but by its faculty and their achievements. Drawn from all parts of India, MGIMS can boast of eminent full time teachers and physicians, many of whom have won prestigious National and International awards. Five of our faculty have received the Dr. B.C. Roy National award. While our Former Director, Dr. Sushila Nayar, was the recipient of the highest award of Medical Person cum statesman, Ex Deans Dr. J.S. Mathur and Dr. P. Narang received the award in the category of eminent medical teacher, Dr. B.C. Harinath for developing the specialty and Dr. P.B. Behere in the category of 'Socio-Medical Relief'. Three of the teachers, Dr. S. Chhabra, Dr. B.S. Garg and Dr. MVR Reddy have received best teacher awards from Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for the years 2006, 2007 and 2011 respectively. Dr. S. Chhabra has also received Distinguished Community Services Award for emergency obstetric care from International Federation of Gynaecology & Obstetrics.

A: OBJECTIVES OF INTERNSHIP TRAINING PROGRAMME:

At the end of training, the Intern shall be able to:

- i) Diagnose clinically common disease, make timely decision for referral to higher level.
- Use discreetly the essential drugs, infusions, blood or its substitutes and laboratory services
- Manage all type of emergencies medical, surgical, obstetric, neonatal and pediatric
- iv) Demonstrate skills in monitoring of the National Health Programmes and schemes
- v) Develop leadership qualities
- vi) Render services to chronically sick and disabled.
- vii) Render specific services to the cases from the tribal and backward regions of the State

Failure to produce log-book, complete in all respects duly certified by the concerned authority to the Dean/Principal at the end of Internship Training Programme, may result in cancellation of his or her performance in any or all disciplines of Internship Training Programme. The intern shall maintain a record of work, which is to be verified and certified by the medical officer/ Head of the Unit under whom he works.

E: EVALUATION:

Evaluation of Interns for assessing eligibility for issuing Internship Completion Certificate by Heads of the Medical Colleges:

The evaluation system shall assess the skills of a candidate while performing the minimum number of procedures as enlisted with an objective that successful learning of these procedures by a candidate will enable him to conduct the same in his actual practice.

- ii) The evaluation shall be done on or before the completion of the posting in following disciplines:
 - a. Medicine and Allied: Medicine Department
 - b. Surgery and Allied: Surgery Department
 - c. Obstetrics & Gynaecology: Obst.& Gyn. Department
 - d. Community Medicine: Community Medicine Department

Following the evaluation, the concerned Head of the Department will submit the statement of marks obtained by the candidate, to the University and the concerned Head of the Institution, within one week from the date of completion of evaluation with signature of the candidates against the marks obtained. A candidate shall have the right to register his grievance in any aspects of conduct of evaluation/award of marks, separately to the concerned Head of the Department and Head of the Institution, within three days from the date of completion of his evaluation. If a candidate is declared as unsuccessful in any of the disciplines he shall be required to repeat the posting in the respective discipline for a period of 30% of the total number of days/months, prescribed for that discipline in Internship Training/posting.

Courses duration & Training:

- 1. It will be a three years residency system for degree course and two years for Diploma Course (as per MCI rules). Degree course after Diploma will also be for two years.
- 2. The period of training as a post graduate student will be a full time assignment & the candidate shall put in regular attendance fro the period prescribed by Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences to the entire satisfaction of his/her guide & Head of the Department.
 - It is mandatory to all Post Graduate students to attend minimum 80% of training during each year starting from 1st May to 30th April. Any candidate who fails to fulfill said criteria, term of such candidates shall be extended till such time, said candidate fulfills 80 % attendance during a year as specified above.
- 3. In case students' term is extended they will have to complete the extended term with required attendance. However, stipend will be paid for only 37 months in case of Degree and 25 months in case of diploma.
- 4. Every Candidate who joins M.D. /M.S. course is required to submit a plan of thesis approved by the Institutes Ethics Committee within 6 months. Of his /her joining the course or by last date prescribed by MUHS, Nashik, whichever is earlier. He /she is required to submit the final thesis after completion of 2 ½ year of his/her joining the course or as per the requirement of the University.
- 5. The candidate will be eligible to take the M.D. /M.S. final examination only after approval of his/her thesis.
- 6. All candidate are required to put in 6 complete terms of training in the concerned department after registration for degree & 4 terms in diploma course.
- 7. All the students admitted to the post graduate course shall maintain a log book which is mandatory as per the affiliating university, MUHS, Nashik. The aim of log-book is to evaluate the training program on a day to day basis so as to ascertain the eligibility of the the candidate to appear for the final university examination for the degree/diploma. Following are the objectives of maintaining of the log book:
 - 1. To help the resident to maintain the day to day records of work done by him/her.
 - 2. To enable the faculty to have first hand information about the work done by the resident & suggest improvement for better performance.
 - 3. To confirm the participation in post graduate training activities like ward rounds , presentation of scientific article at journal club, case clinics, post graduate seminars, clinical symposia & book reviews .
 - 4. Assessing the skills acquired by residents in patients care, teaching & research.

5. To confirm level & degree of participation in research activities.

Leave Rule for P.G.

The registered P.G. Students can avail leave as follows:

- 1. Those registered for P.G. Degree/diploma courses can avail 15 days Earned leave and 15 days casual leave for each year starting from 1st May to 30th April. Casual leave cannot be carried over from one year(as specified above) to another year. However earned leave can be carried over but cannot be encashed by taking accumulated earned leave at the end of PG course as preparatory leave.
- 2. Thus a candidate registered for PG degree can avail a total of 90 days leave during the three years course, whereas the candidate registered for PG diploma course can avail a total of 60 days leave during entire course of two years. This leave has to be availed within the prescribed duration of the PG course i.e. up to the 30th April of the last years of the course. It cannot be carried over after that .Any candidate who avails leave more than that specified above, the total tenure will be extended by one or more terms as the case may be.
- 3. Normally Casual leave for more than 3 days at a time will not be sanctioned.
- 4. There is no provision of sick leave, maternity leave and preparation leave (before examination).

CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1 The general control of students is vested with the Dean.
- 2 Students admitted to MGIMS are expected to Exhibit high standards of academic interest and responsible behavior, befitting professional level of maturity.
- 3 Students admitted to MGIMS are expected to follow the code of conduct as follows
 i) wearing khadi clothes ii) consume vegetarian meals iii) eschew smoking, drinking
 and other intoxicants iv) participate in community prayer, shramdan and such other
 - activities as may be prescribed from time to time v) must be free from any prejudice regarding, caste, creed or untouchability vi) girl students must tie their hair and boy students should have tidy hair when at work in the college and hospital.
- 4 Residing in the hostels of the Institute is compulsory for all students.
- 5 Students after admission to the Institute are given an Orientation Training Course for a fortnight in Sevagram Ashram for getting sensitized to Gandhian ideology. If it is found that they are unable to adjust themselves to the environment, their admission may be cancelled.
- 6 Attendance in the Social Service camp, whenever it is held is essential, failing which the student may not be allowed to appear in the University Exam.
- 7 Students who do not maintain a satisfactory standard in academics or in the observance of code of conduct or discipline shall neither be allowed to hold office in extracurricular bodies or be eligible for scholarship or given any other assistance.
- 8 Students should maintain 75% attendance with minimum 80% in practical to be eligible to appear in the university examination.
- 9 Permission must be taken from the Dean for any leave or absence from classes or to go out of station. All students must report to the warden before leaving and on return from leave. In case of illness during leave a medical certificate must be sent immediately.
- 10 All illness should be reported to the Warden at the earliest.
- 11 Students must pay for all damages caused by them to books and property of the Institute.
- 12 Fees shall be paid on the date notified by the Dean's office. Mess fees shall be paid in advance for 6 months with term fee. Balance if any, shall be refunded at the time of leaving.
- Ragging in any form is absolutely forbidden and as per the provisions of Maharashtra Act XXXIII known as "Maharashtra Prohibition of ragging Act of 1999", students indulging in ragging can be punished under the Act resulting in suspension, and even expulsion from the Institute and imprisonment.

Prevention of Ragging:

RAGGING IS A COGNIZABLE OFFENCE AND IS FORBIDDEN IN ANY FORM. ANYONE INDULGING IN RAGGING WILL BE PUNISHED UNDER THE ACT RESULTING IN SUSPENSION, EXPULSION FROM THE INSTITUTE AND IMPRISONMENT. THE PUNISHMENT FOR RAGGING WILL BE MENTIONED IN THE COLLEGE LEAVING CERTIFICATE.

The Supreme Court has defined the ragging as under:

Clause No.6: Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or in disciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student. The cause of indulging in ragging is deriving a sadistic pleasure or showing off, power, authority or superiority by the seniors over their juniors or fresher.

Punishable ingredients of Ragging

- Abetment to ragging
- Criminal conspiracy to rag
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- Public nuisance created during ragging
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt
- Wrongful restraint
- Wrongful confinement
- Use of criminal force
- Assault as well as sexual offences or even unnatural offences
- Extortion
- Criminal trespass
- Offences against property
- Criminal intimidation
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- Physical or psychological humiliation

Punishments

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits
- Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension / expulsion from the hostel
- Cancellation of admission.

- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period.
- Fine of **Rs** 25,000 to Rs 1 lakh.
- Collective Punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- 14 The candidate after taking admission to this Institute shall have to give an undertaking counter signed by his/her parents that he/she shall not indulge in any activity which amounts to ragging and if he/she is found guilty he/she shall be punished as per the disciplinary rules of Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram.
- 15 Fees shall be paid on the date notified by the Dean's office. After the said date, fees will be acceptable only within a period of one month with a late fee fine as notified. After this period the name of the student will be struck off from the Institute Roll. The student may be readmitted on the payment of Rs 1000 as readmission fee alongwith clearance of all dues.
- 16 Continuous absence from the classes for over one month without any valid reason will make the student liable to be removed from the institute Rolls. He/she may however be readmitted with valid reason on the payment of **Rs 1000** as readmission fee in addition to clearing all dues.
- 17 As per MUHS, Nashik every student has to attend a minimum of 80% practical and 75% theory classes to be eligible for appear in University examination.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Following rules and regulations as amended from time to time, are applicable to all medical students.

1) General Rules:

- 1. The general control of students is vested in the Dean.
- 2. Students admitted to the Institute are expected to:
 - i. Lead simple life
 - ii. Wear Khadi
 - iii. Take vegetarian meals
 - iv. Eschew smoking, drinking and any other intoxicants.
- 3. Students after admission to the Institute are given an Orientation Training Course for a fortnight in Sevagram Ashram to introduce them to Gandhian thought and way of life. If they are found unable to adjust themselves to the environment, their admission may be cancelled.
- 4. During the 1st Semester, attendance in the Social Service Camp is essential, failing which the student may not be allowed to appear in the University Exam.
- 5. Students who do not maintain a satisfactory standard in academic or in the observance of college code of discipline shall not be allowed to hold office in extracurricular bodies or be eligible for scholarship or any the assistance.

2) Rules for class attendance:

- 1. Regular and punctual attendance at lectures, demonstration, laboratory work, clinics and class examinations is essential. Students who do not have 75 percent attendance or whose progress and conduct are not satisfactory, may not be allowed to appear at the University Examination.
- 2. There shall be no condoning for shortage of attendance.
- 3. All students are required to note that they fulfil the attendance requirements to avoid unpleasantness at the time of registering for the examination.
- 4. Continuous absence from the classes for over one month with out any valid reason will make the student liable to be removed from the college Rolls. He may however be readmitted on the payment of Rs. 1000/- as readmission fee in addition to clearing all dues.
- 5. It has become mandatory to send quarterly attendance to the university after which it will not be possible to change the attendance so students have to ensure that they fulfil the attendance in each quarter. In case their attendance is short it will be informed to their parents.
- 6. When the teacher enters the classroom the students should rise and remain standing till they are asked to sit or till teacher sits down. When the attendance is taken by the teacher, each student as his/her name or roll number is called must rise up from his/her seat and answer to his/her name.
- 7. No student shall be allowed to leave the classroom without the permission of the teacher or until the class is concluded.
- 8. Students are expected to assemble in the classroom five minutes before the appointed hour when the roll shall be called and the absence of any student noted.
- 9. Students are not permitted to remain in the lecture hall except during the hours of instruction.

3) Dress Rules:

- 1. Only khadi clothes are permitted
- 2. Dress should be neat and clean.
- 3. Girls with hair longer than shoulder length, should have their hair put up.
- 4. Aprons are compulsory for boys and girls.
- 5. Gaudy dresses should not be worn.

4) Leave Rules:

- Student leaving the hostel on Sundays & Holidays must apply and take permission to do so from hostel authorities and should not proceed on leave till it is sanctioned.
- 2. The student shall submit application in duplicate to the officers nominated by Dean for permitting the students to go on leave, on working days separately for Preclinical, Paraclinical, Final part I and Final part II. The post graduate students shall take leave sanction from their respective Head of the Departments.
- 3. The leave will be sanctioned by the respective teachers names of whom will be circulated to the students and the student shall inform the sanction of such leave to the concerned departments.

4. The officers shall also send a copy each of such sanction to the Warden / Lady Hostel Supdt. and student section for record.

5) Hostel Rules:

- 1. Residence in the hostel of the Institute is compulsory for all Under Graduate students.
- 2. Postgraduate students will be given accommodation in the hostel if the rooms are available and that will be done as per the rules.
- 3. The rent of the hostel shall be paid in two equal installments as per the prospectus along with term fees.
- 4. Students on allotment of the rooms will take over the charge of the rooms including the glass-pans, electric installation and the furniture. Any damage or breakage during the occupation period will be charged from the student concerned.
- 5. A student must hand over the charge before leaving the room with all fitting, fixture and furniture intact to the Warden J.N. Hostel (Boys) / Supdt. Ladies Hostel.
- 6. Students in their own interest are strictly prohibited from keeping money, jewelary or any other valuables in their rooms. They should also ensure that they lock their rooms while going out as a safety against possible thefts. Hostel authorities will not be held responsible for any loss. A student should report to the hostel authorities immediately for investigation if his/her lock is tempered with or broken or a theft has taken place. No student shall report such matter directly to the police.
- 7. Keeping unauthorized occupants including friends and relatives in the hostel is not permitted.
- 8. Student must keep his/her room clean and tidy. He / She must throw hair, papers, fruit-skin or any other kind of refuse articles in the waste paper basket provided for and then should throw in the dustbin provided outside.
- 9. He / She must remain properly dressed and not commit any nuisance, shouting, and playing of Radios, Gramophones etc. loudly in the room / hostel campus which will be seriously viewed.
- 10. He /she must not spoil soil or disfigure any part of the building, compound, garden etc.
- 11. He / she shall leave the bath room and latrine after use as clean as he / she would like to have when he/she visits the place.
- 12. Wastage of water must be avoided by closing the taps when not in use.
- 13. Meals are not allowed to be taken in rooms unless a student is ill or it is permitted by the Warden / Supdt. Ladies hostel. In case of the rule is violated a fine of Rs 100 may be imposed.
- 14. Wastage of food must be avoided. Any leftover food on the plate must be thrown in the dustbin before washing his/ her plate by the student. Chocking of wash basins must be prevented by them.
- 15. Student must not interfere with any electrical installation in hostel. Use of electric lron and applications for making tea etc. is permitted in the utility room only. No other electrical appliances are permitted in the Hostel. Students must see that

the lights and fans are switched off when the rooms are unoccupied, failing which they will be liable for disciplinary action. Abuse and wasteful use of electric current or unauthorized fitting of any connection will make them liable for penalty and disciplinary action.

- 16. No male student is allowed in the inside of the Girls Hostel and vice-versa, except on official occasions when mixed gathering are allowed.
- 17. Guests, friends or relatives of the same sex may be allowed on Sundays and Holidays at specified hours notified by the hostel authorities to visit in the respective hostels. They will not be allowed to do so on working days and during college hours unless specifically permitted by the hostel authorities.
- 18. No visitors shall stay in the hostel unless they are permitted by the hostel Authorities in writing.
- 19. No student is allowed to remain absent from the hostel after 10.00 p.m. (Girls) and 10.30 p.m. (Boys) without the permission of hostel authorities.
- 20. Permission must be taken from teacher In charge authorized for permitting leave of absence from classes or to go out of station. All students must report to the warden on return from leave. In case of illness during leave a medical certificate must be sent immediately.
- 21. Ragging in any form is absolutely forbidden and is punishable by fine, rustication or expulsion from the Institute.
- 22. All illness should be reported to the Warden as early as possible.
- 23. Students should ensure that any personal issue of married students (related to wife /husband) or boyfriend/girlfriend should not disturb the tranquility of the hostel, it should be sorted out at their personal level or by their families.

6) Disciplinary Rules:

- 1. A disciplinary committee of the college will be formed consisting of the faculty Members nominated by Dean
- 2. This committee shall handle all charges of misconduct against the students.
- **3.** The Committee is empowered to consider all disciplinary charges and to recommend penalties.
- **4.** The Dean shall finally decide the disciplinary action.
- **5.** Any student who disobeys a lawful order given by the Dean, shall be subject to disciplinary action
- **6.** A Student committing any breach of discipline as specified below will render himself / herself liable for disciplinary action:-

MINOR MISCONDUCTS

- 1) Absence from lectures/clinics/practical/training programmes without any valid reason/permission. Found indulging in ragging of juniors.
- 2) Overstay of sanctioned leave/vacation.
- 3) Any conduct/action due to which the fellow inmates are disturbed.
- 4) In spite of repeated instructions if the hostel premises is kept unclean by the inmate

5) Absence from other place/activity officially requiring the presence of the students

MAJOR MISCONDUCTS

- 6) Absence from hostel, without leave/permission.
- 7) Absence from university exam without any valid reason like sickness/hospitalization etc.
- 8) Prolonged absence from college without permission from college.
- 9) Absence from college exams without valid reason.
- 10) Using unfair means in tests/examinations/practical.
- 11) Use of criminal force to fellow students.
- 12) Neglect of studies and unsatisfactory progress in academics.
- 13) Disobedience of orders and insubordination to teaching staff.
- 14) Grouping under the banner of religious or political outfits should be avoided. Nobody should try to force their belief or habits on other students.
- 15) Violation of standing orders or any other orders of Dean.
- 16) Smoking & Drinking in the college campus is not permitted. Violations of this act shall be cause for discipline.
- 17) Any student, who uses, possesses, consumes, is demonstrably under the influence of, or sells any liquor, in violation of law shall be subject to discipline.
- 18) Any student who, uses, possesses, consumes, is demonstrably under the influence of, or sells any narcotic drug or controlled substance, in violation of law, shall be subject to discipline.
- 19) Any student who significantly disrupts any college function by intentionally engaging in conduct that renders it difficult or impossible to continue such a function in an orderly manner, shall be subject to discipline.
- 20) Any student who, while in any college facility or participating in a college related program, commits theft or possesses stolen property, or commits robbery, shall be subject to discipline.
- 21) Any student who causes or attempts to cause physical damage to property owned, controlled, or operated by MGIMS, or to property owned, controlled, or operated by another person while said property is located on college facilities, shall be subject to discipline.
- 22) Any student who in this or any other manner is guilty of malicious mischief shall be subject to discipline.
- 23) Any student who, while in any college facility or participating in a college related program, shall interfere by force or violence with, or intimidate by threat of force or violence, another person who is in the peaceful discharge or conduct of his/her duties or studies, shall be subject to discipline.
- 24) Any other breach of discipline not mentioned above but contrary to any provision of the Code of Conduct, Dean's order or Notices/Instructions issued from to time.

7. <u>Penalties and Punishments</u>

The competent authorities to award penalties/punishments will be as approved by Dean.

a) Removal from College Rolls

A student will be removed from the rolls of the College by the appropriate authority on the grounds of:-

- 1. Unsatisfactory disciplinary conduct.
- 2. Unsatisfactory progress during training.
- 3. Absence from college and /or failure to appear in University examinations

b) Suspension from College

- 1. A student may be suspended for a term or more on academic grounds as decided by the College Council.
- 2. A student may be suspended for a term or more by the college authorities on disciplinary or administrative reasons.
- 3. On suspension or being struck off college rolls the student will vacate the hostel within 48 hours and proceed directly to the place of residence of his parent (s) or his legal guardian if parents are not alive.
- 4. The college has no liability, whatsoever, if the student proceeds elsewhere.

c) Fine

Fine of Rs 250 can be imposed on minor offenses by the Warden or Head of Department. A fine up to Rs 1000 will be imposed by the Dean.

d) Publication of Punishment and Penalties

Major/Serious punishments and penalties will be published in the College notice board.

Basic Neonatal Care and Neonatal Resuscitation Training Workshop Department of Pediatrics

For the last 22 years, the Department of Pediatrics, MGIMS has been a pioneer in the country by initiating and regularly conducting Basic Neonatal Care and Neonatal Resuscitation training workshops for last 23 years for the final year MBBS students, a unique activity in the country.

Over the time, we have evolved this activity based on various principles of adult learning and tried to make it more learner friendly. We dropped off most didactic lectures and incorporated extensive hands on learning of the skills on the mannequins. On the first day we organize a one day Basic Neonatal Care workshop in which we discuss various basic, nevertheless important, aspects of newborn care like prevention and management of hypothermia, feeding of normal and low birth weight babies, neonatal jaundice, neonatal sepsis, respiratory distress, danger signs etc.

On the second day, we organize a one day Neonatal Resuscitation Training Workshop. In this, we make small groups of 8 students each where they can interact with the facilitator faculty, give feedback together. break other and could learn We whole newborn resuscitation algorithm into specific individual skills and start with how to prepare for the birth. The whole class learns the same topic simultaneously by first watching a video demo together as a large group and then breaking down into small groups and practising the skills at their own table. As the day passes by, we move from preparation for birth, routine care at birth, initial steps of resuscitation, bag-mask ventilation and chest compressions, to advanced care.

The response has been overwhelming and students completely love this workshop. We also invite the foreign students from Maastricht University, Netherlands who are posted for their 6 weeks internship at the Pediatrics Dept. Their feedback is also extremely gratifying and they are thrilled at the richness of the learning experience.

Posting 1 - PBL Case 1

What are the services available for me?

During her routine visit to a family, Auxiliary Nurse Mid -wife (ANM) Anita is told that 24 year old Meena is 5 months pregnant. On asking her Anita discovers that she has never got her health check -up done after becoming pregnant.

Anita: Come for your health check up to the Anganwadi center in your village duringthe next village health nutrition day.

Mother -in -law of Meena: I had been advising her to visit Anganwadi Center to register her pregnancy and also to meet you. But, she did not follow my advice.

Meena: What are the services available? Why should I come there?

Anita explains the services that Meena will receive during her pregnancy including screening for danger signs and counseling.

E-learning initiative at MGIMS, Sevagram

In year 2014-15, MGIMS, Sevagram has launched an e-learning platform to complement the classroom, clinical and community-based training of under-graduate and post-graduate students. The institute has decided to use MOODLE as a VLE, which has been installed in a section of MGIMS server.

The primary objective of the E-learning initiative at MGIMS is to enhance the learning experiences of our Undergraduate and Postgraduate students through principles of blended learning within the campus. However, once the teachers are trained in E-learning, there would be immense potential for supporting education through e-learning. Some of the potential uses of this platform could be:

- Developing courses on personal and professional development for our students
- Supporting our students during their rural posting
- Developing e-learning courses for continuing professional education of practitioners, both public and private sector
- Developing courses for in-service training of various cadres of health care providers in public health system

After permission from authorities of Kasturba Health Society as well as MGIMS, Sevagram, work on this initiative was started. The following activities have been completed till now.

The following activities have been conducted:

- 1. Formation of three institutional level groups/ committees: For smooth functioning of elearning initiative, three institutional level groups/ committees have been formed –E-learning advisory committee, Core E-learning team (comprising of trainers and problem solvers), Group of nodal persons from each department (nominated by the head of departments). The first meeting of E-learning advisory committee was held in May 2015. The core E-learning team had several meetings to decide the issues related to training of faculty members
- Identification of Moodle as the virtual learning environment and installation over MGIMS server: Moodle was identified as the virtual learning environment to be used for E-learning at MGIMS, Sevagram and it was installed on the MGIMS server. The url of the MGIMS e-Classroom is http://www.mgims.ac.in/classroom
- 3. Development of a blended learning course on 'Developing Course with Moodle': a blended learning course was developed on MGIMS e-Classroom. The training comprises of an online course of 4 weeks duration with 4 contact sessions once a week. The online course has been developed on the Moodle platform so that the faculty members get acquainted with Moodle, the virtual learning environment which has been selected for developing the e-learning platform at MGIMS, Sevagram. In addition, for each participant, a separate practice course on our web server is created so that the skills of creating an online course could be easily practiced.
- 4. Training of faculty members on the blended learning course 'Developing Course with Moodle': It was decided to train all faculty members in 'Developing Course with MOODLE'. More than 100 faculty members were trained in 6 batches of this blended learning course by the end of Sep 2015.
- 5. **E-learning planning cluster meetings**: A 2-3 hours course planning meeting with all the faculty members in five clusters (Pre-clinical disciplines (MBBS Part 1), Para-clinical

- disciplines (MBBS Part 2), Community Medicine, Eye & ENT (MBBS Part 3A), Medical specialities, and Surgical specialities (MBBS Part 3B)).
- 6. **Finalization of guiding principles for E-learning:** A draft document on guiding principles for developing E-learning course was initially developed by core group on E-learning, which was later vetted by all departments during the E-learning planning cluster meetings.
- 7. Formative research for scaling e-learning in the institute: The core e-learning team has also planned a few formative research. In one of these initiatives, the team is assessing the preparedness of faculty and students for e-learning. Under this, survey of undergraduate students, six focus group discussion with under-graduate students, and in-depth interview of 20 faculty members have been planned. The data collection for this will be over by the end of August 2015.
- 8. **Roll over of rights of course manager within their categories to each department:** The core e-learning team has already started roll over of rights of course manager to two faculty members (on recommendation of Head of Department).
- 9. **Sensitization meeting with under-graduate students (batch-wise):** Sensitization meeting has been done with 2012, 2013 and 2015 batch.
- 10. Development of first online course: A complementary course for social service camp and village adoption scheme has been prepared by the faculty members in the department of Community Medicine. This course was offered to 2015 batch of students during their social service camp. Subsequently, it is being utilized to disseminate resources and guidelines for monthly village visits to the students.

The E-learning core team plans the following activities for the future:

- 1. Development of another blended course on 'Competency-based blended learning': Apart from training on use of MOODLE, the faculty members also require training/ mentoring on best practices in pedagogy while developing an e-learning course and challenges of integrating it with classroom learning. This will mostly come with experience. The core e-learning team is also planning an online course on 'competency based blended learning', through which the best practices while using e-learning in a campus-based scenario will be discussed. The participants of this course will be expected to prepare a high quality practice course demonstrating how blended learning could be used for competency-based medical education.
- 2. **Preparation of integrated course on diabetes:** This will also serve as a model courses for all faculty members
- 3. A system for need-based support to faculty members, while they develop E-learning courses
- 4. A system for training of new faculty members: A system of training new faculty members needs to be devised for both the courses, 'Developing Course with Moodle' as well as 'Competency-based blended learning', once it is developed.
- 5. A system of continuous monitoring and enhancement of blended learning
 We need to gradually build a system of supervision and monitoring. It needs to be thought in greater detail. However, it may not have any monetary implications.
- 6. A regular system of orienting our students for use of the VLE

 The orientation may be done in a 2 3-hour workshop by our faculty members. We will
 prefer a batch of 25 students for these workshops. We may also explore the possibility of
 developing e-learning course on Moodle itself for this purpose.

Faculty members who have been permitted under the rules to attend National. International Conference, Workshops, scientific meets within the country will be entitled for reimbursement of registration fee, Boarding & Lodging expenses and Travel expenses only once in a year as follows:

For Conference: Registration fee upto Rs. 10,000/- will be paid only on production of documentary evidence of paper presentation/chairing session.

For Workshop & CME: Registration fee upto Rs. 10,000/- will be paid only on production of documentary evidence of attendance.

Amended rule (w.e.f. 01/05/2014): Rs. 2500/- per day for not more than 3 days for Boarding and Lodging expenses will be paid only on production of documentary evidence.

2 Tier AC Train fare on actual basis will be paid only on production of original railway tickets except 3 Tier (IInd Class).

An amendment in the rules regarding amount sanctioned for International Conference was considered & therefore, the circular previously circulated vide outward No. KHS I-6 (A)/291 dated 09/05/2006 was again circulated vide outward No. 382 dated 11/5/2012. Now again the amount permitted against Registration charges has been revised & therefore in supersession of the previous circulars, the rules are given below:

Special Leave: Special leave for a period not exceeding a total number of 15 days in a year will be granted to an employee by the appointing authority for attending educational or a scientific conference or a course approved by the University, State or Central Government or an International Agency inside or outside the country. Out of the above 15 days, special leave may also be granted to a faculty member to enable him to be an examiner in other Medical College/University provided such faculty member spends atleast five days for attending conference/workshop/seminar outside the Institute in a calendar year. Special leave can be combined with any other kind of leave such as Earned leave, Leave without pay, Casual leave etc. No interposing of weekly Off / Holiday will be allowed.

Reimbursement of Registration fees, Travelling Allowance and Accommodation Charges (Boarding and Lodging Expenses)

w.e.f. 1/1/2006 Faculty members who have been permitted under the rules to attend National, International Conference, Workshops, scientific meets within the country will be entitled for reimbursement of registration fee, Boarding & Lodging expenses and Travel expenses only once in a year as follows:

For Conference: Registration fee upto Rs. 10,000/- will be paid only on production of documentary evidence of paper presentation/chairing session.

For Workshop & CME: Registration fee upto Rs. 10,000/- will be paid only on production of documentary evidence of attendance.

75% of the Boarding and Lodging expenses subject to ceiling of Rs. 5000/-, will be paid only on production of documentary evidence. In case of faculty lodging at friend/relatives residence, incidental charges upto Rs. 2,500/- will be admissible.

2 Tier AC Train fare on actual basis will be paid only on production of original railway tickets except 3 Tier (IInd Class).

For Faculty Members attending National Teachers Training Course: All rules of reimbursement as per conference/workshop.

Note: If reimbursement under conference/workshop has already been availed in the year, then reimbursement for Teachers Training will not be granted.

IMPORTANT: ALL THE ABOVE WILL BE PAID FOR ONE CONFERENCE ONLY - CLAIMANT MAY HOWEVER CLAIM THIS AT THE END OF THE CALENDAR YEAR - JANUARY TO DECEMBER. FOR ANY ONE CONFERENCE OUT OF ALL THOSE ATTENDED DURING THAT YEAR. NO SPILL OVER TO THE NEXT YEAR WILL BE PERMITTED.

IF REIMBURSEMENT IS SOUGHT FOR MORE THAN ONE CONFERENCE DURING THE YEAR, PRIOR PERMISSION OF THE PRESIDENT, KHS WOULD BE NEEDED.

For attending International Conferences out of the country – Faculty is granted permission once in 3 years. Amount sanctioned will be Rs. 40,000/- (Forty Thousand Only) or 1/3 rd of the expenditure incurred, whichever is less and preference will be given to the outstanding faculty members which will be decided by the President, KHS.

SUBJECT: "PROCEDURE OF DOUBLE EVALUATION (EVALUATION

> & RE-EVALUATION) SYSTEM OF ASSESSMENT OF THEORY ANSWER BOOKS PERTAINING TO ALL UNDER

GRADUATE AND POST GRADUATE COURSES".

WHEREAS the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act 1998 (Maharashtra Act No. X of 1999) has come into force from 03rd June 1998;

AND

WHEREAS it is the duty of the University to frame rules for teaching, training programme and examinations for Under Graduate & Post Graduate courses in affiliated colleges / institutes in various faculties as provided under sub - section (1) of section 29 of the said Act;

AND

WHEREAS prescribing rules for conduct of examinations is a subject matter of Ordinance as provided under section 50 (vi) of the said Act;

AND

WHEREAS there is an ordinance 01/2002 in existence for conduct of examinations;

AND

WHEREAS Rule 61 of the said Ordinance prescribes the system of moderation but there is no provision of 100% Re-evaluation of all Under Graduate & Post Graduate theory papers;

AND

WHEREAS due to non availability of 100% Re-evaluation of all the Answer book(s), the University has extended the facility of Challenge Re-evaluation of theory examination answer books for all Under Graduate & Post Graduate courses vide Direction No.03/2012 and 04/2012;

AND

WHEREAS as per decision of the Academic Council of the University, the facility of Challenge Re-evaluation has been abolished by withdrawing the Direction No.03/2012 & Direction No.04/2012;

AND

WHEREAS consequent upon the abolition of challenge Re-evaluation, it is expedient to introduce the appropriate system of evaluation to ensure the students to receive a fair and just evaluation of their performance in theory examination;

AND

WHEREAS if the new system of evaluation is being introduced it is essential to repeal/modify/amend the existing rule 61 of the ordinance No.01/2002 suitably;

AND

WHEREAS making or modifying an Ordinance is a time consuming process;

AND

THEREFORE, I Prof. Dr. Arun Jamkar, Vice-Chancellor of Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, in exercise of powers conferred upon me under sub-section (8) of section 16 of Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 issues the following direction.

- 1. i) This Direction shall be called as "PROCEDURE OF DOUBLE EVALUATION (EVALUATION & RE-EVALUATION) SYSTEM OF ASSESSMENT OF THEROY ANSWER BOOKS PERTAINING TO ALL UNDER GRADUATE AND POST GRADUATE COURSES".
 - ii) It shall come into force with effect from the date of its issuance, by repealing/ amending the Rule 61 of the Ordinance No.01/2002.

2) **DEFINATIONS:-**

- (i) **Evaluation:** Means the assessment of the answer book(s) done by the Ist Examiner.
- (ii) Re-Evaluation:- Means the assessment of the answer book(s) done by the IInd Examiner.
- (iii) The definitions given in the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 shall be applicable to this Direction, unless there is anything repugnant in the subjects or context.

3) APPLICABILITY:-

This Direction shall apply <u>only</u> to theory papers (Section-B & Section-C) of all Under Graduate & Post Graduate University conducted theory examinations and shall not applicable for viva/clinical/practical examinations. This Direction shall also not applicable to Ph.D, Super Specialty and Fellowship programme examinations.

4) PROCEDURE FOR ASSESSMENT:-

- (i) All the answer book(s) shall be evaluated by the First Examiner at the CAP (i.e. Central Assessment Programme) as directed by the University.
- (ii) The CAP custodian shall tear off mark slip of answer book assessed by the First Examiner and keep all of them in appropriate order.
- (iii) The CAP custodian shall arrange for Re-Evaluation of all the answer book(s) by the Second Examiner as directed by the University.
- (iv) The CAP custodian shall keep all **Mark Slips** of Answer book(s) on which First Examiner have allotted the marks and **Mark List** in one envelope marked as **"Packet-A"**.
- (v) The CAP custodian shall keep all **Mark Slips** of Answer books on which Second Examiner have allotted the marks and **Mark List** in one envelope marked as **"Packet-B"**.
- (vi) It shall be the responsibility of the CAP custodian to ensure that all attempted answers are assessed by both of the Examiners.
- (vii) The scrutinizer working under CAP custodian shall do totaling of marks and if, finds any error/mistake in totaling of the marks shall immediately bring to the notice of the CAP custodian. It is also the

duty of the scrutinizer to see that every answer has been assessed by the first and the second examiner.

- (viii) It shall be the CAP custodian's responsibility to get rectified such totaling mistake(s) (if any) from the concerned examiners and also to get assessed the unassessed answer(s) (if any) by both the examiners.
- (ix) The CAP custodian shall submit such sealed envelopes of Mark Slips & Mark List (Packet A & B) to the Examination department of the University as directed by the University.
- (x) The Result Section of Examination department of the University shall take higher of the total marks given by either of the two examiners i.e. best of two for final computation of the result. Such higher marks shall be considered as marks obtained by the concerned examinee for the particular Paper/subject as applicable.

For e.g. If the total marks given by the first examiner in evaluation of Answer sheet is suppose 40 and the total marks given by the second examiner in re-evaluation of Answer sheet is suppose 42, the University will considered 42 marks as marks obtained by the concerned student in the particular paper/subject.

- 5) The Evaluation and Re-Evaluation i.e. double evaluation shall be carried out simultaneously at respective CAP Centers.
- The separate Re-evaluation facility shall not be available to the candidates as double evaluation i.e. Evaluation and Re-evaluation has been carried out by the University before declaration of the results.
- 7) The existing facility of Verification/Re-totaling of marks shall be continued for theory (Section- B & Section- C) and practical answer sheets and mark lists.
 - **7.1)** The non-refundable fees for Verification/ Re-totaling shall be Rs.500/- per Paper/Per Practical (For Example if the candidate applying say for verification for both of the paper-I and paper-II, for the subject of Anatomy, he/she will have to pay Rs.1000/- and like wise). The University reserves the right to change the said fees from time to time by way of issuing suitable notification displaying on University website.

- **7.2)** The candidate who has failed in practical examination(s) head and desires for Verification/ Re-totaling of marks of the practical answer sheet and mark list may apply to the University through his/her College within a period of 10 days after the declaration of the results in the prescribed format attached to this Direction. (Annexure- A)
- **7.3)** The applications for Verification/ Re-totaling of Answer book(s) and Mark Lists received at the University after such a period shall not be considered. The postal delay/ delay on the part of concerned College or Student shall also not be considered by the University.
- **7.4)** The candidate desirous to apply for Verification/Re-totaling should submit only one application for one or more subject's or part of the subject.
- **7.5)** The photocopy of theory answer book(s) will be provided to the candidates for their information & records only.
- **7.6)** The photocopy of theory examination paper will also be provided to the concerned student under Right to Information Act, 2005 after payment of necessary prescribed fees within its retention period.
- **7.7)** The prescribed format for obtaining the photocopy of theory Answer book is attached to this Direction. **(Annexure-B)**
- **7.8)** The fees for photocopy of answer book(s) shall be Rs.500/- (Non-refundable) per paper/ answer book. The University reserves the right to change the said fees from time to time by way of issuing suitable notification displaying on University website.
- **7.9)** The candidate desirous to obtain photocopy(s) of theory examination paper (Section-B & Section-C) shall have to apply within 30 days from the date of declaration of the results.
- **7.10)**The incomplete/incorrect application without prescribed fees shall be rejected. Applications received after due period shall not be considered by the University under any circumstances. The University shall not entertain any correspondence in this respect.
 - **8)** This Direction shall remain in force until an Ordinance is made in this behalf by the University.

Guidelines according to the MCI booklet

Interns shall acquire skills to deal effectively with an individual and the community in the context of primary health care. This is to be achieved by hands on experience in the district hospital and primary health center. The details of the training are as under:

I Community Health Center (Rural Hospital)/ District Hospital/ Attachment to General Practitioner

- I.1 During this period of internship an intern must acquire:
- I.1.1 Clinical competence for diagnosis of common ailments, use of bed side investigation and primary care techniques
- I.1.2 Gain information on 'Essential drugs' and their usage
- I.1.3 Recognize medical emergencies, resuscitate and institute initial treatment and refer to suitable institution
- I.2 Undergo specific Government of India/Ministry of Health and Family Welfare approved training using Government of India prescribed training manual for Medical Officers in all National Programmes (e.g. Child Survival and Safe Motherhood EPI, COD, ARI, FP, ANC, Safe Delivery, Tuberculosis, Leprosy and Others, as recommended by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare)
- I.2.1 Gain full expertise in immunization against infectious diseases
- I.2.2 Participate in programmes in prevention and control of locally prevalent endemic diseases including nutritional disorders
- I.2.3 Learn skills first hand in family welfare planning procedures
- I.2.4 Learn the management of National Health Programmes
- I.3 Be capable of conducting survey and employ its findings as a measure towards arriving at a community diagnosis
- I.4 Conduct programmes of health education
- I.4.1 Gain capability to use audiovisual aids
- I.4.2 Acquire capability of utilization of scientific information for promotion of community health
- I.5 Be capable of establishing linkages with other agencies as water supply, food distribution and other environmental/social agencies

II Primary Health Center

- II.1 Initiate and participate in Family composite health care (birth to death, Inventory of events)
- II.2 Participate in all of the modules on field practice for community health, e.g. safe motherhood, nutritional surveillance and rehabilitation, diarrhea disorders etc.
- II.3 Acquire competence in diagnosis and management of common ailments, e.g. malaria, tuberculosis, enteric fever, congestive heart failure, hepatitis, meningitis, acute renal failure etc.
- II.4Acquire proficiency for Family Welfare Programmes (antenatal care, normal delivery, contraception care etc.)
