It needs to improve in terms of (1) Internal and external communication - i.e. how it communicates its values, short and long term goals, fostering a healthy relationship between various dept staff and students, newsletters or online discussion fora etc; (2) Connecting with alumni - i.e. alumni are not involved in any aspect of the medical school's teaching, management, clinical or research activities except when, individual alumni and teachers have developed a personal bond over time or some alumni have a connection to the institute on a personal level; (3) Transparency in administration and governance so that alumni feel confident about the institute's internal working especially when marketing their alma mater on national/international platforms; (4) its image and work culture as an employer so that it attracts the best quality teaching staff who will make MGIMS their preferred option in terms of employment. This wil require an honest internal review of what is working well and what is failing badly within the various departments. Only when the institute has on paper the SWOTs, can it actually come up with a plan to address/ utilise this information; (5) Open culture where blame is not apportioned to a student or staff or covered up when a mistake happens but is instead seen as an opportunity to learn for all those involved; (6) Make CPD an essential and well attended regular activity across all specialities; (7) Improve hostel
