

































## Antarchakshu® — The Eye Within

#### About Antarchakshu®

Antarchakshu® — The Eye Within, conceptualized by the Xavier's Resource Centre for the Visually Challenged XRCVC, is an experiential workshop aimed at creating a sneak preview for the sighted into the world of persons with disabilities in general and blindness and low vision in particular. It is a simulated environment where participants, through experiencing a disability simulation, will learn to reflect on personal attitudes towards persons with disabilities. This simulation is then followed by an interactive session. The objective of the workshop is to equip its participants with insight, understanding and basic facts about the lives of the visually impaired, the 'How?' of their lives, as also to foster an insight in developing their own perspective on the issue. Antarchakshu® serves the dual aim of not only sensitizing participants to disability but serves as a potent tool towards personal growth and motivation.

Krishna Warrier has over 30 years' experience in Journalism and Communications Skills. After his career in journalism he has been working in the area of disability awareness. He has held senior editorial positions in Reader's Digest, Hindustan Times, Mid-day, and Centre for Monitoring the Indian Economy (CMIE). He has trained students in

various facets of communication at institutions like St Xavier's College, Sophia College, KC College, Wilson College, Xavier Institute of Communications (XIC), IITB-Monash Research Academy (IIT Bombay), etc. Additionally, he has held training and sensitisation workshops across India for corporates like IBM, Hindustan Unilever, BNY Mellon, Sanofi, Deloitte, etc. Trekking and table tennis are his other passions.

The Xavier's Resource Centre for the Visually Challenged (XRCVC) is an integral part and department of St. Xavier's College - Autonomous, Mumbai which is a premium educational institution run by The Bombay St Xavier's College Society. The XRCVC was started in 2003 as an effort to ensure an inclusive environment at St. Xavier's College, one of the most well-known educational institutions in the country, for its students with blindness and low vision. Having created an inclusive set-up for its own students, and keeping with the college's long tradition of creating social impact within the larger community, the XRCVC has today become a national advocacy and support centre for inclusion.
