#### **(B) INTRODUCTION**

##### **MGIMS: Quality Medical Education**

The institute strives to produce doctors of high clinical competence, professional attitudes and ethical behavior. We, at MGIMS, are conscious of the fact that medical education

### **Unique code of conduct**

### **Orientation Camp**

Soon after admission to the MBBS course, Orientation Camp is organized for the students. They live in Gandhiji's Ashram for 15 days, where they are oriented to Gandhian ideology and learn the Gandhian way of life. Drawn from different geographical and cultural backgrounds of the country, this phase helps them get acquainted with each other and respect mutual differences.

### **Research**

The focus of the Institute has been on community based medical research. Quality research has been the hallmark of this rural institute and the large number of funded projects awarded to the various departments is ample testimony to the potential of the researchers. ### **(E) Bond Conditions:**

A. As per Maharashtra Government Resolution (G.R. No. MED 1007/CR-490/07/Ed-2 dated 8th Feb 2008 and any G.R issued in this regard from time to time), candidates joined against the seats of Government/Municipal Corporation colleges for admission to MBBS Courses either through GOI nominee, All India quota or through NEET UG 2023 will be required to sign a bond to serve the Government of Maharashtra or local self-government or Defense services for a period of one year, after the completion of internship, failing which he/she will be required to pay Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupees ten lacs only) for the default as penalty.

Secondly, he/she will be required to sign an undertaking to the effect that he/she will not leave India within a period of five years from the date of obtaining the degree, otherwise he/she will have to pay Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rs.Ten lacs only) as penalty.

Additionally, as per Maharashtra State Government Decision Med 1021/Pra Kra 28/21/ Education-02 dated 13/06/2022, one year service is mandatory for all the candidates admitted to the MBBS course as social obligation from the academic year 2023-24.

B. As per Maharashtra Government GR No. MED 1016/Pra.Kra.345/16/Education-2 dated 05/01/2018 and DMER Letter No. DMER/Private/Nongranted/Bond letter/8-A dated 21/11/2019 an Indemnity Bond of Rs. 10,00,000/- is to be submitted by the candidates completing MBBS course from Government aided and Private Unaided Medical Colleges for serving in rural areas of Maharashtra for a period of one year.

C. FOR LAPSE OF SEAT : As per Maharashtra Government Resolution No. CET 3516/CR 169/Edu-2 dated 13/04/2017 any candidate responsible for lapse of MBBS seat will have to pay a penalty of Rs.10,00,000/- (Rupee Ten Lacs Only). This penalty is applicable to all those candidates who do not join during last round or cancel a seat after last round of admission. This penalty is also applicable to any candidate resigning a seat after cutoff date for MBBS/BDS course or also fails to complete the course, irrespective of admission quota of the candidate.

The selected candidates will deposit the above mentioned amounts (referred to as Security Deposit which shall be adjustable against recovery, if any) by way of NEFT/RTGS/Online at the time of his/her admission which shall be retained as Security Deposit as under :-

**\* Rs. 45,000/- [Rs. Forty-Five Thousand] which shall continue to be retained as Security Deposit till the time of successful completion of the prescribed Internship Training by the concerned candidate. Such deposit, subject to recovery, if any, may bear the simple interest at the rate applicable to Saving Bank Account as per RBI Norms and as shall be decided by the Kasturba Health Society from time to time.**

**\*\* Rs. 70,000/- [Rs. Seventy Thousand] for General + OBC candidates & Rs. 50,000/- for S.C./S.T./V.J./N.T candidates, which shall continue to be retained as Security Deposit till the induction of an authenticated evidence in the Office of Dean, MGIMS in support of successful completion by the concerned students of a service in area of need for such period as prescribed by Government of Maharashtra, after completing the term of his / her internship training. Such deposit, subject to recovery, if any, may bear the simple interest at the rate applicable to Saving Bank Account as per RBI Norms and as shall be decided by the Society from time to time.**

**At the time of admission Rs. 4,41,960/- for General / PH + OBC category and Rs. 4,21,960/- for Reserve Category {SC/ST/VJNT}. This includes deposits of Rs. 1,65,000/- for General / PH + OBC category and Rs. 1,45,000/- for Reserve category**

**{SC/ST/VJNT} to be paid at the time of admission and will be refunded after successful completion of the course.**

The amounts of Security deposit so retained shall be refunded only on production of Original Receipt, issued at the time of respective deposits appended to the claim for refund, if any.

### **(G) HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION**

- Hostel accommodation is compulsory for both boys and girls and are available within the campus of the Institute.
- Mess/Canteen facilities are available in the campus.

### **(H) RULES / REGULATIONS/ CODE OF CONDUCT**

1. Students admitted to MGIMS are expected to follow the code of conduct as follows:-
  - a. Wearing khadi clothes.
  - b. Consume vegetarian meals.
  - c. Eschew smoking, drinking and other intoxicants.
  - d. Participate in community prayer, shramdan and such other activities as may be prescribed from time to time.
  - e. Must be free from any prejudice regarding, caste, creed or untouchability.
2. Attendance in the Social Service camp, whenever it is held is essential.
3. Fees shall be paid on the date notified by the Dean's office. Mess fees shall be paid in advance for 6 months with term fee. After the said date, fees will be acceptable only within a period of one month with a late fee fine as notified. After this period the name of the student will be struck off from the Institute Roll. The student may be readmitted on the payment of **Rs 5000/-** as readmission fee along with clearance of all dues.
4. Continuous absence from the classes for over one month without any valid reason will make the student liable to be removed from the institute Rolls. He/she may however be readmitted with valid reason on the payment of **Rs 5000/-** as readmission fee in addition to clearing all dues.
5. Ragging in any form is absolutely forbidden and as per the provisions of Maharashtra Act XXXIII known as "Maharashtra Prohibition of ragging Act of 1999", students indulging in ragging can be punished under the Act resulting in suspension, and even expulsion from the Institute and imprisonment. The candidate after taking admission to this Institute shall have to give an undertaking counter signed by his/her parents that he/she shall not indulge in any activity which amounts to ragging and if he/she is found guilty he/she shall be punished as per the disciplinary rules of Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram.
